Along with the ski season fast approaching, we have had a number of new folks join the TOSV team in the last few months. THE BULL WHEEL STARTS TOMORROW

Starting tomorrow we can put those pesky skins away and start riding a comfortable chair up the Mountain. With the Mountain opening, Transportation will be adding Route 4 (Town Park n ride skier shuttle) service to accommodate skiers parking in the Rodeo Lot. The rest of the routes will be amping up over the course of the next week. Enforcement of Timed Parking will commence on Wednesday, November 27 (Lots #6 and upper #5, also 30 minute Treehouse lot). Permit parking enforcement will commence on Thanksgiving Day. Guest Services will start working tomorrow to welcome all guests at the Town Park information center, which will be open every day the mountain is open for skiing from 8:30a-2:30p. And, S'mores are back...we will be serving free s'mores every day from 3:30-4:30p at BOTH Snowmass Base Village and the Mall. The Mall location will be near the Tower and Stewpot where the Romero Group is installing new fire pits. We estimate that at 216 calories per s'more, we will serve nearly 13 MILLION CALORIES this winter season! Pace yourselves...

- Ice Ice Baby, well not yet but it looks like the weather is going to start helping us with cold temps at night. Will it ever stop? Yo, I don't know... but we will start skating as soon as we can. Word to your mother!

- We are continuing to work through the State’s planning process to ensure our transportation projects are eligible to receive state grant funds. The Snowmass Transit Station (at the Mall) remains the top priority for all projects in Pitkin County. We have also added the electrification of our bus fleet to the list. Electrification of the fleet, at over \$16 million, is a long term goal, but still a goal we wanted to get on the state list. Finally, the eventual bus stop improvements at the intersection of Owl and Brush Creek are also on the state list.
- This week we received Jeff Kremer’s letter of resignation from the POSTR Board.
- Just in time for ski season, both new Variable Message Signs have been installed at the main entrances to the Village. While the physical work is largely complete, we are still working to load software to operate the signs. We expect to have the signs live (of course with a message rivalling MTV’s “Video Killed the Radio star”) for Thanksgiving weekend.
- Applications for the TOSV Community Grant are on the street. Every organization that has received a grant from the Town in the last 5 years received notice that the application is available. Applications are due back by December 31.
- We are sending letters to all Boards and Commission members whose terms are about to expire asking them to consider submitting their membership applications by December 29.
