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Q4a-1. Are there any topics of interest not included in the Town Council's Strategic Goals listed in Question 3 that you feel should be one of the Town's top priorities? If YES, what issue?

- (1) The town should not be subsidizing (not charging) Krabloonik's lease. The fact that they have received continued support from the town amidst blatant animal rights abuses is beyond disappointing. There is absolutely no reason for the council to renew their lease, and, if they do, the town will be openly supporting this joke of a business. The council has the blood of abused dogs on their hands, this is their opportunity to make it right...shut them down. (2) Resident input on significant developments in the town needs to be heard more. The town is literally turning Snowmass in to Vail. The council preaches building a community, but all they are doing is making it feel less like one. We are a town, not a cruise ship. There can be a healthy balance.
- (1)Over expansion of hotels on the mountain. (2)The over regulation of the short term rental market. (3) creation of a fenced in dog park.
- 1) Over building of new residential and commercial buildings. 2) I DO NOT believe that gov't should limit short term rentals.
- 1. Employee Housing (ownership). 2. Get rid of the real estate sales transfer tax. Could win any employee housing lottery, finally bought a free market condo, then got wacked with the transfer tax.
- 1. Quit trying to move the rodeo. Do not continue with the grandiose plan for a transit center. Scale it back to a more reasonable plan.
- 1.short term rentals of individual homeowners. Protecting view planes of homeowners, e.g. overgrowth of tall trees limiting views.
- Affordable housing for fulltime worker.
- Approve and get the Owl Creek and Brush Creek roundabout going. The intersection is an embarrassment and is growing dangerously problematic with the fast recent growth of our community. The crosswalk, the long lines of traffic backed up trying to turn off of Owl Creek Road and the effectiveness of our fire department all will improve with the roundabout.
- Architectural control. Make some trails exclusively to hikers.
- Balancing summertime event so they do not have a detrimental impact on the community/tourists not involved in the event. For example, the power of four mountain bike race had a huge impact on the town as it took over most of our bike trails not on the ski hill. From my perspective, that is acceptable as it is a "local event." In the past, the other mega events, ragnar, tough mudder, spartan race are races that outside organizations financially benefit and place an excessive burden on the community without a community or significant financial benefit as most participants camp. While the yoga event bring participants whom are extremely annoying it is a unique event and brings a financial benefit. I believe this place is so special, we deserve the right to be pickier about what we allow to occur. Thanks.
- Balancing the needs of the locals against the needs of the tourists. Crowd control, parking, types and amounts of tourist sought. i.e. The car show is a ridiculous environmental disaster that interferes with local road usage. Too many bike races, not policed or publicized sufficiently--dangerous for hiking on trails and gives priority to bike racing tourists to hikers.
- Before creating more housing, the existing system needs a Compliance Auditor and more stringent policies in place to ensure that the system is serving the community to the greatest

extent possible. I live in TOSV rental housing and would have no problem with verifying my employment within Snowmass Village at every lease renewal period.

- Better garbage collection and snow clearance. In the pines there is no garbage collection. We don't have a pickup truck which makes collecting and taking the garbage to the dump a huge hassle. Why isn't this development included in garbage pick up? As we don't get shuttle service either the snow clearance is much worse than it was when he had a home in Horseranch. Why? We love Snowmass and stayed here when we needed a larger home but these 2 issues are very aggravating especially as we are getting older.
- Bike paths are in terrible shape
- Bike trails that are not maintained by the town of Snowmass any more like Luge, Banzai, most of the trail on that of the hill
- Bring back the kids entertainment for the kids and their families.
- Can't the council stop or at least slow down all the development and try to keep Snowmass "just big enough"? Developers are the only ones who come out ahead. Running empty busses all over Snowmass especially in off season when anyone needing a ride can call in for a pick up since it only takes 10 minutes to get anywhere in town. Everyone has a phone now. It would save dollars as well as pollution for our fragile environment.
- Commercial, retail and guest bed development and its impacts on the community feel and increase in traffic flow.
- continue protection of local wildlife - continue to preserve the open space and breeding & migration grounds of local wildlife
- Continue to find the appropriate balance between community and resort. Continue to liaise with and receive input from part-time residents.
- Continued expansion and maintenance of the town's trail systems (both paved and unpaved).
- Control development and don't make exceptions to please a developer that is only here to make money, not support the community. At a certain point (after the center is complete) no more development is needed. If more comes, Snowmass will be forever changed.
- create interesting shopping and food venues for a more vibrant community
- Creating a greater sense of community among full-time residents
- Decreasing marketing dollars
- Define the town and the resort. Lately, it seems like the resort is more important than the town. Snowmass tourism needs to be reminded that people actually live in Snowmass Village and call it home. We have been barraged and inundated by special events and marketing that tries to fill every day of the Summer season with trite things to do. It is too much, and I want town council to know that there is a growing resentment toward the constant "more, more, more" mentality of Snowmass Tourism.
- DESPERATELY NEED DOG PARK
- Effective employee housing management and enforcement of qualifying rules after the move in and regular audit of lease agreements, checking employment verification. There should not be any STRs allowed in Snowmass Village!!!!
- Eliminate political statements
- Employee Housing supports different housing needs and supports the workforce. This is from seasonal to year-round housing, but in a tasteful fashion or not squeezing employees into a small box. Housing needs to support the mountain and family lifestyle. Providing housing options for

workforce housing helps support our schools, reduces traffic on Hwy 82, creates a community, and allows families to be together and not in a car.

- Events. The town should be looking at bringing in events that actually help local businesses and are more family friendly and stop bringing in events that are centered around alcohol. The "drunk fests" are getting old and not a contribution to this community.
- Eventual establishment of commuter rail from upper valley all the way to Grand Junction area. Local buses could service local areas off this line. This might help solve long-term demands for affordable housing and the ability to get to a place of employment within a reasonable amount of time (if no remote work is permitted) and lessen the amount of traffic on the roadways.
- Every Trail is over run with mountain bikes. It is unsafe for hikers. We need a good, dedicated trail for humans and off leash pups. Dogs and people need spaces too.
- Excessive potential spending on transit center, excessive spending on potential round-a-bout , lack of allowing e-mtn bikes on Smass single tracks
- family values, opportunities to learn together such as the Mastadon discovery. What a wasted opportunity to shine and teach. Honestly, the mountain is becoming a rich person's playground. Thank goodness for ACES or we'd just be a fancy dress up ski/eat/drink location.
- Fire prevention. We need the fire department, National Forest Service, towns of Snowmass and Aspen to cut and remove standing dead. If a large fire should happen during a very dry windy summer it would be extremely dangerous and would totally destroy our economy for years if not decades. Our owners and guest have the means to go anywhere around the world for an environment that suites them. Rarely are they tied to this area for business.
- fire prevention: we need to remove all standing dead in the Village because it is just fuel for any fires. Should we have a windy dry summer like we did in 2021 a strong fire could devastate not only our way of life but the economy of the Village. Many people who are owners and guests to Snowmass can basically afford to vacation anywhere in the world. They have many options and we are in constant competition for the resort dollar and should our scenic valley and amenities be destroyed, it would most likely take decades to come back. We work and live in this valley. We need to work with the National Forest Service, Pitkin Counties fire departments and local government to come up with a plan and implement as soon as possible. We were extremely lucky this summer with all the rain we got.
- Guiding Community Development/Construction for a sustainable future
- Housing. More employee Housing
- I am concerned about the amount of traffic all the new condos will bring as well as what will happen to restaurants and business when the "hot beds" go away for the season.
- I have been on a waiting list for a P.O. Box since 2020. Is it feasible / logistical to create more prior to The Center large scale renovation?
- I think the resident parking situation in lots 1-12 is terrible. This past winter parking access has been very limited. I have spoken to parking enforcement and they said they are writing lots of tickets but the fines are so low that visitors don't have an issue paying the low fine as it is only slightly higher than paying for parking at the village. Also, we are encouraging every tourist to rent a car who rent those condos, stay at the View. There are more red plate cars than I have ever seen. Also the summer parking is out of control. when are you going to require permits? I have no problem paying for seasonal parking. Please address ASAP.

- Illegal parking/need to enforce with more effort, diligence. Enforce trucking road use hours on Owl/Brush Creek - sooooo NOISY during off-hours.
- Improve management, performance, and effectiveness of resources already being collected
- Improving road surfaces. Wish we could have paved Brush Creek Rd at least to the roundabout. The Post Office needs to be fixed.
- In the event that creating more affordable housing for the workforce could take years to come to fruition, the town should find a way to help small local businesses financially as costs of commodities and especially labor have gone up considerably. Small local businesses cannot compete with giant corporations from out of the state that are able to buy up once locally owned businesses in the area and pay their employees inflated wages because they can afford to break even or even take a loss in order to advertise the name Aspen Snowmass in association with their business. The small and locally owned “Mom and Pop shops” cannot match those wages and afford to stay in business much longer.
- Increase aesthetics of the Snowmass Mall, which is a concrete eyesore (and therefore bad for the environment).
- Increase finer dining / retail in conjunction with all the new construction which is occurring in Base Village. Same with traffic issues.
- Insuring the economic viability of the small business owners and restaurateurs in Snowmass. STR rental night restrictions, for example, compromise economic viability.
- Issue with increasing traffic on Brush creek and the need for either Cameras or traffic light at Sinclair/ Brush Creek and also Owl Creek / Brush creek intersection. I have almost been hit by both visitors and other people with local plates that are distracted drivers using mobile devices! I use the existing crossing lights however people that are distracted simply do not pay attention at all!
- Less concerts! Less loudness and bring back the car races!
- Limit short term rentals to Commercial areas. The horse
- maintain the small town, family safe culture.
- maintaining the community character. too often the community character of Snowmass is not provided the appropriate consideration when discussing the future of the Town
- Maintenance of infrastructure. Bridges, roads, and water ways keep us all safely connected. Childcare and education seem important, I have no kids but recognize the importance for everyone!
- make sure the tourists keep coming
- Marketing department is out of touch, does not understand their role, has an excessive budget.
- Mask mandates ruin communities
- Monitor community development better, we cannot continue to create jobs without housing! we have developed sooooo much over the last years that we no longer have a post office to fit the needs of our town!
- More trails- mountain biking & hiking.
- More transparency between government and residents of the community .
- More vibrant music, food and arts events
- need more well built trails to continue Snowmass as a leading MTB destination
- Need to discuss the e bike issues. My class one e mountain bike should not be considered the same as a class two and should be allowed on OUR single track trails. Most areas around the US

are now allowing class one e bikes to ride their single tracks. Let's get on board with so many other areas that have done the research and now consider the class one bike the same as a regular mountain bike.

- number 4 environmental sustainability and resiliency
- Parking of 1.5 spaces per bedroom should be a minimum. Everywhere. No stacking.
- Parking. Intersection of Owl Creek and Brush Creek. Construction noise on weekends.
- Pedestrian safety on hiking/biking paths. Need speed bumps before driveway intersections. Stop signs no deterrent .
- please deal with the density of vacation beds in the town. it's no longer a town, but a tourist trap. please consider more parking at two creeks. can't even park at the base anymore, and the amount of trash and dirty dog bags is really sad. consider a roundabout at Owl Creek and Brush Creek Roads.
- Please make it easier to find out about the Town's rules and regulations...I.e. what are the noise restrictions (building and outside concerts, etc.). We found it impossible to navigate the policies online. Also no truck engine brakes.
- Poverty. With the incredible amounts of money in Snowmass, Aspen and the Roaring Fork Valley, eliminating poverty should be top of the list. Distribution of funds from private and public wells is necessary for all to make gains who are working and employees aren't valued accordingly, paid low pay check to pay check wages. Everything depends on everything else so please try and make this place a model of consideration and action.
- Protecting the environment within the town limits.
- Put more money into trail repair and repaving. Again more money into noxious weed mitigation?
- Reducing the impact of over-tourism.
- Reduction of construction noise and impact. Constructions in this town is insane, there is a serious lack of leadership in regards to maintaining peace and quiet in our idyllic mountain town
- Repaving existing dilapidated and dangerous paved bike trails both for safety and to keep road bikers off the roads. Some of these trails have been neglected for over 5 years!! Increased parking at access points to mountain biking trails to avoid spillover onto roads and shoulders.
- Restaurants and businesses open longer throughout the year, local specials, more local events then only July and August, more town involvement in businesses to ensure they are open and up to par, more compliance for workers only in employee housing, aid available for seniors to find housing elsewhere, sidewalks
- Restrict short term rentals.
- Road Repairs and Snow Plowing/Ice Removal in the winter.

- Slow down the influx of tourism. There are too many events and too many people.

- Slow growth, if any. We may already be at our sustainable level. Why do we need more, more, more?
- slow the pace of development and construction of new housing. the new construction in the base village is overwhelming, and new condos in Snowmass Center is a bad idea. For one thing, by the law of supply and demand, new construction limits increases in the values of existing properties. Also, condos there combined with a bigger post office will make parking inconvenient.
- Snowmass is growing too fast. There are already too many big construction projects at Base Village. I'm not in favor of any new major construction projects until what has been approved and is in the pipeline gets completed. This goes for plans for a big new transit center at the Mall. Let's wait. The pace of new construction is too fast.
- STOP developing/growing/building/destroying Snowmass Village! If you stop building more insane hotels/resorts/etc. you won't need to build more employee housing ! It's not about building MORE employee housing, it should about stopping the development! Just STOP it.
- Stop development- more employee housing is not the answer. Less development = fewer employees = less housing required
- STOP THE DEVELOPMENT, WE CANT KEEP CREATING JOBS WITHOUT HOUSING. BALANCE!!!! IT IS INSANE TO THINK YOU ARE EVER GOING TO SOLVE THE HOUSING WITH HUGE HOTELS AND CONDOS THAT NEED HUNDERDS OF PEOPLE BEING BUILT! STOP THE MADNESS, AND SERIOUSLY ASKING PEOPLE TO SUBSIDIZE MORTGAGE PAYMENTS????? wtf RUN OUR TOWN CORRECTLY!
- Stop the urbanization of the Village
- STR regulations. Our town is dependent on tourism, especially the working class. Make sure STRs are safe and managed correctly and stop messing with the traditional lodging options that have been available for over 40 years. They are not the problem.
- Subsidizing housing for employees who might lose it when their kids grow up or asking them to invest their savings in a home that has an appreciation cap is not helping anyone. How is someone supposed to retire? Have a home for their children to visit? Live in fear that they will be homeless if they switch jobs? We are well past the time of helping working people live in SMV. Basalt, Carbondale and GWS are close enough.
- The biggest issue is that workforce and senior housing is lumped in the same question.
- The consistent lack of transparency in how affordable housing is allocated to those who work 40+ hours per week in SMV. It has always been a "who you know" approach not how long you have worked in SMV.
- The excessive construction that hinders operation of local businesses
- The increased density and traffic and corresponding impact on wildlife, environment and quality of life.
- The local bus service through Creekside Apartments/Brush Creek Apartments need to resume.
- The Rodeo has been a part of this community for 50 years and remains an attraction for locals and visitors. The current town manager and some of the elected officials have been expressing interest in slowly doing away with this unique to the west event, which takes care of its animals, in contrast to the Spanish bullfighting. This change in direction seems to reflect the personal bias of these individuals without regard for the history and tradition which brings large numbers of people to enjoy our community for its uniqueness. Do not downsize the Rodeo for additional soccer fields which serves far fewer people.

- The standards to acquire housing are too stringent and many are not meeting those requirements. Not their fault. The system requires us to work an unseasonable amount of hours
- The Thursday night concert vendor was awful this year. ASC events department did great previous years...this year there were long lines and not very nice people with only one site at the top of the hill. Pedestrian safety on Brushcreek Road especially from Owl Creek uphill to the Mall. Whatever was tried with the re-aligned white and yellow lines up to the mall is just more confusing I don't think anyone knows where they are supposed to walk or drive. Distributed composting containers to dumpsters around town over the one drop spot at the facility building. OMG...the post office...PLEASE. I know it is a federal office but WOW!
- The town's top priority should be keeping Snowmass Village's small town rural character. We do not need roundabouts, large transit centers, or redesigned entrances. I would support the improvements to town park but it encroaches on the wetlands and increases parking. Finish base village and don't build any more large tall buildings. I'm very disappointed that the town center redevelopment includes so many residential buildings up the hill to the northwest. The priority should be to not urbanize SMV.
- There needs to be a traffic light at Brush Creek and Owl Creek road as soon as possible! I have seen far too many "near misses" at this busy intersection. The light is necessary because the drivers on Owl Creek run out of patience waiting to turn onto Brush Creek Road and take chances pulling out into traffic, in addition, a good amount of drivers are traveling too fast down Brush Creek and have to jam on their brakes abruptly for those coming out of Owl Creek Road. This is truly a hazard and really should be addressed promptly with a traffic light for now and perhaps a round-a-bout in the near future.
- To clarify, need to focus on employee housing, not necessarily senior housing
- To limit development
- Too many special events causing overcrowding and stress on the village's infrastructure. Summer parking is horrible and unmanaged. Town Park usage lacks control and management for weekly events - many of which are good for the community and/or historical.
- TOSV should recognize and represent open market homeowners as equally a part of the community and not just some resource for more subsidized housing. EVERYBODY needs to pay into the RETT, not just open mkt owners. Please make real efforts not to pit employees against homeowners. We are one and the same. Homeownership is not a right, contrary to the narrative being pitched. You are owed nothing by the community. Instead we are all part of this community. STR's are not just some resource to be controlled and exploited, they are vital to business and people's very existence in the valley. It is trendy to treat STR's as the source of the housing issue, but the truth could not be further away. Raising taxes (read: fines) will drive off not only tourism, but open mkt ownership as well. What's better- homes generating income for the community's government and businesses or empty homes most of the year?
- Truly affordable housing. Not affordable housing that is close to 1 million dollars. I definitely feel that we keep hearing how important the "locals" are, but community actions make it seem otherwise. I hear all the time that it is the wealthy people living, visiting etc. here that make it possible for the working class to live and work here. However, they have driven up the prices of absolutely everything here, making it near impossible to live and work here. It is the locals and working class that make EVERYTHING possible here. Stepping off my soap box...

Too many other departments are having to pick up the slack and the citizens are having to deal with the lack of planning and preparation for some of these events.

- SMV Building department, in error, approved an "administrative change" to our neighbors home. The approved permit was based on mis information. When we asked the town's building department to rectify their error (permit approval based on faulty "administrative change" status) they pushed the problem over to Homeowners Associations. This is clear negligence on the town's part. They should have corrected their mistake instead of passing the buck to the homeowners associations. The builder who applied for the building permit, misrepresented the building situation, and never got any homeowner approvals.

- The Public Works Dept (** Anne Martens) has been very responsive when neighbors and I have reached out - but we still have a safety issue on Oak Ridge Road in Snowmass Village. We'd love to know when the Village can widen Oak Ridge Road, whether completely repaving it or just repaving the outer edges to achieve a widening. We have been told that there are a few areas where the town would be restricted from widening it, but where it CAN, when can that happen? Cars have to veer off pavement to pass each other and do get stuck in the gravel and dirt shoulders of the road. The gravel helps for a time, but gets dispersed and tires get stuck.
- The remodel of mountain view has been enormously disturbing
- There are more stakeholders in the ski business than the Aspen Skiing Co. in Snowmass Village. Present all options of like kind services in relation to skiing services.

- We have one of the best local bus services and recreation possibilities around. Town has supported our outstanding electrical services and water Sanitation facilities with local partners.
- We just purchased a place less than a year ago and trying to learn more about and engage with the community which is why I answered "don't know". The biggest issue I see (and perhaps bc I don't know) is how to access transportation to outdoor rec spaces like maroon bells. I usually have a vehicle when I'm in town but my guests often don't. How do they get to these spaces?

- We will never be rid of the friction between citizen and service delivery as getting one's way frequently defines satisfaction. Committed manager and department leaders make the difference.
- Would like to get a playground put in at the Mountain View apartments. Would also like safe stroller access to the brush creek trail from Mountain View. The new stairs are nice, but I still have to push my stroller on brush creek to get across the street at creek side to access brush creek.
- Wrote town official about pedestrian safety on Brush Creek Rd. hiking/biking path and got no response.
- Yes as I said above would LOVE garbage pick up. As we age this chore is more difficult and it's unreasonable that an entire community paying the same level of taxes gets less service. Better and earlier snow clearance in our neighborhood would be nice too. This winter was pretty dangerous driving in the pines.
- Yes. While the housing department is burdened with an impossible job, it is disheartening that a unit at creekside was allowed to be vacant for over 5 years as the owner deceased with no heir. The town attorney opted to take no action (slippery slope for the town and justified) but more importantly is not addressing the situation through policy changes for any future units. As our community ages, it is important for the housing department to have legal guidelines/responsibilities/rights established in the event an owner dies and the family is unwilling to take responsibility. Time to write a policy to address this, Dresser!!!!

- Absolutely build more rental housing. Stop building deed restricted housing.
- again!!! we would NOT need so much more housing if we stopped creating jobs we don't need. this is simply about tax dollars not quality of life or vacation in Snowmass Village.
- Again.....2BR condo vacant for 4 years at Creekside.
- As a 35 year real estate capital markets professional I believe deed restricted real estate is flawed. The town is better off renting affordable units, maintaining proper reserves, and ensuring desirable living conditions. owning a house is expensive and limiting the benefits of appreciation lead to moral hazard and dilapidated properties. This is one of the reasons the Aspen model is a disaster.
- As a married, 38yr old couple, both working year round in Snowmass, it is extremely frustrating and hard to want to stay here when for 3yrs and 6months we have not been able to find year round affordable housing and somehow do not seem to be moving up the waitlist. We did not leave high paying city jobs to take a huge pay cut and have no where to live just so that we could also commute an hour to work. We took the pay cut to live where we work and want to have fun.
- Betsy is amazing
- Betsy is no Joe
- Betsy, Terri, and staff (and previously, Joe) have always been top tier. Their attentiveness, dedication, and concern for the well-being of tenants continues at an A+ level.
- Better assistance with upkeep on deed restricted units. Since we can't appreciate improvements due to caps on capital improvements many units are in poor shape. There is simply no incentive to improve units.
- better reimbursement for major upkeep items - better incentivization of keeping properties in good repair
- Better under direction of Joe Coffey.
- Build more rental units for families that work in Snowmass
- Businesses such as skico, Viceroy, the Viewline, should pay for their employees subsidized housing, or increase their salaries. This should not be the town's financial responsibility.
- Can't comment-not familiar enough for intelligent response
- Compromise on dogs
- Employment requirements for deed restricted units should also include people working for aspen valley hospital and aspen school district in the first priority group.
- Families should be allowed to have and build equity. It does not make sense to limit net worth for deed-restricted properties. People need to save for retirement, not game the system by 1. hiding assets, 2. buying expensive cars and recreational vehicles because they can't have money in the bank if they want to keep their homes or 3. allowing retired community members to stay in deed-restricted properties, especially when kids have moved out. Instead, allow families to save for retirement, move out when they no longer qualify because of employment or number of people living in the home has gone below required level. This allows new community members/employees to have a chance to get housing when they need it. Isn't this the way the system is suppose to work?
- Homeowners' dues and property maintenance associated with deed restricted housing make affordable housing unaffordable. If the Town were to snowplow or reduced the costs of water and solid waste it would help. Property Management Companies are charging the same rate as second homeowners and people who can afford these services.

- Housing department is a joke. Do they check whether people are actually here legally and working in Snowmass Village or do they just let anybody in at the expense of true hard-working locals.
- I am disappointed that a major capital replacement item like a \$15,000 roof cannot be added to the resale value of the house.
- I believe the housing that has been more recently built is waaaay to expensive. Maybe the quality of the build warranted the cost, but maybe the products could be built a bit cheaper. I know many ideas on builds are in the works but lets GET GOING...The housing shortage didn't just happen!!! Sounds to me like the cost of "exploring" round-about is RIDICULOUSLY high & does not make sense.
- I don't have any comment on this.
- I favor limited employee housing and for it to be rental only, with requirements to be a current employee. I don't think government should be building senior housing.
- I feel large businesses should be required to provide funds for housing. And strict guidelines be in place for people owning deed restricted housing, but owning other properties out of state purchased after acquiring lottery property.
- I feel the town needs to make sure the deed restricted owners are in compliance with the requirements for continued occupancy. There are quite a few violators that are keeping qualified people from acquiring housing.
- I have had good interaction with the housing dept
- I moved into Mountain View with hopes of starting a life and a family in this town. However it appears to me that I can only do that while sheltering inside my 330 square foot unit with my wife...our hopes of moving up or out into a family home within snowmass seem like a pipe dream reserved for the wealthiest. It's been 6 years and I truly feel stuck inside my mold and mice filled home with a ever diminishing hope of starting a family(inside something other than a studio) in this otherwise paradise filled town. At least we have a dog to keep us sane... we'll that's not true because we are not allowed dogs :(
- I think multifamily units are more important than single family homes. Let's face it - no more space. We will have to build more density - why waste resources so a handful of families can have a house?
- I think that as in other areas of the valley there are a lot of people in deed-restricted housing that no longer qualify for the unit and this needs to be better regulated. There are people who should no longer be taking up a unit that could be used by someone who is actually working in Snowmass or Pitkin County.
- I will say that I am satisfied with the "requirements for continued occupancy", but would like to see actual enforcement of individuals who are not meeting the requirements. There are many of these examples in Snowmass Village Housing that should be addressed. So maybe a better annual accountability system is needed.
- I wish we could just take one hole from the golf course... haha. I mean, turn it into a par3 and add housing. God, I wonder how many people that would be upset
- I would continue to reach out to existing deed restricted homeowners for their feedback. They are living in the properties built by the town and have real life experiences in those smaller communities. Reach out to them/create safe spaces to hear their experiences/feedback
- I'd like a playground for the Mountain View apartments. Families are prioritized so we ought to prioritize a safe place for children to play together. Would also like a community bike rack for Mountain View. There have been mice in my unit for the past 18 months (since I moved in). I've had multiple maintenance requests (which have been completed), however I do believe there can be more done to inhibit the mice from entering my unit (my neighbors don't have mice). I believe

we need new flooring - the carpet in the dining area is surely holding years worth of food and grime, and updated bathrooms/kitchens. There is mold that I cannot get out of the bath tub where the prefab bath pieces come together. There is mold in the bathroom walls due to leaks, but again, that can't be addressed without an update because paint doesn't fix mold. For some reason all of the downstairs outlets are "stretched out" and plugs do not stay in or charge, they just fall out.

- it is important to turn over workforce housing when an individual retires. Workforce housing should be only available when you work as long as one works. when one no longer works, there needs to be a way to get people out of the home so it can be used by the next generation or other working person. For deed restricted housing consider a premium in excess of the calculated selling price paid by the Town.
- It seems like all the reviews on Coffee Place are that the construction is pretty poor. I'm not sure how much attention the housing department does to address these. The housing department also does not follow through on work status that is required to live in TOSV housing.
- it seems unfair to year round employees trying to get housing to continually being pushed down on "the list" to accommodate returning workers who have left the area for 6 months or more and wanting to get back into housing. Those people who leave, should be put at the bottom of the list.
- It would be beneficial to offer an incentive or a requirement to keep deed restricted units in good repair. From our personal experience, it has been difficult financially to fix, replace, and improve all of the big ticket items in our unit that the previous owner had let go for a long time. We had no real recourse in our contract as there were twenty people on the list behind us that would want the unit if we pressed the owner for repairs. Paint and cosmetic items are one thing..but flooring, roofing, appliances/tubs, water heaters, etc. are all big, expensive projects. There should be a requirement or an incentive to keep things to a certain standard.
- It's a joke. How is anyone supposed to live here and work here if the only option you have is free market housing. It's a shame.
- It's very important when building new housing units, that it does not negatively influence the environment.
- I've heard numbers of new beds needed to accommodate the local workforce be over 700 in TOSV alone. We cannot accommodate that much new subsidized housing, so commuting will be necessary for 100s of workers for the foreseeable future. Also, businesses which require housing for their staff should pick up most of the cost of housing their staff, either in TOSV or within an hour's commuting distance.
- Keep up the great work!
- Lack of ability to have children living in employee housing to inherit the home they have been living in and working locally for years! Not being able to add capital expenses to the cost of the owners home. Crossing homeowners were charged for a plan check on the new roofs they added ,excessive charge when so Many similar flood plans ,and so few actual plan checks done!
- Laundry rooms are always pretty filthy. -The machines (washers and dryers) are never cleaned and it always feels pretty gross using them. Why not do a rent discount for a nearby tenant to be in charge of cleaning the machines daily?
- Loan approval should not be required for lottery entry
- Lottery could be more in favor for longer tenured employees, Qualifications should be checked and enforced more often.
- Lottery process should be replaced with a seniority priority. Those who have been waiting the longest should have first right of refusal.
- Maintenance is slow and many complaints are met with 'that's just how the building is'. Our screens on doors and windows should function. Our bedroom doors should swing on hinges.

- Many of my friends have nowhere to live up here. The seniors are being kicked out because they can't work anymore. Where are they going to go?
- More housing for young families and individuals is needed to help keep the community thriving, businesses open (the Mall is a ghost town and it's sad), etc. Seniors should relocate downvalley where it is less icy, there's less elevation, less possible medical conflicts, etc.--I'm very sorry if that sounds callous, but the fact of the matter is that this Valley is quite literally dying from lack of workers and families who are now relocating to Parachute, Silt, New Castle, where it's more affordable or out of area entirely. And please continue to right-size units, and ensure that the lottery process is fair.
- More housing in general, keep remodeling older units, credit card readers for washing machines
- More housing is not the answer. Less Development.
- More housing the number one issue for Snowmass Village.
- More investigations into compliance are needed regarding current owners of deed restricted units and owning other properties within the drainage. There are several owners within Rodeo Place and The Crossing in violation
- More single family homes.
- More timely action taken on occupancy requirements.
- Need more compliance. I only know a handful of those that are in full compliance of housing. I know more not in compliance. I also know many year round employees in Snowmass who couldn't get housing for years. No events in May or June. No businesses open Memorial Day.
- No rules are enforced. There are many businesses that operate out of deed restricted houses. There are a lot of people that own property in the valley and make more money than they are allowed to. Look on Google maps, there are businesses listed on there that are in employee housing. I worked for Andrew Huck for 6 years until February. Our office was his home. What is the point of having rules if there are not enforced. How many people that sell real estate live in employee housing? I bet over half the people living in deed restricted housing would not qualify today. It seems like once you're in you're in. You could win powerball and still have employee housing.
- Not enough affordable housing for employees
- Not enough units. Also some of the rules are nonsense. You can't have a second job in Aspen even if you work fulltime in Snowmass. (80% rule is complete nonsense). I understand prioritizing Snowmass full time year round employees but it's unbelievable you get penalized for having a second job that you literally need to afford to live in this valley. Penalized for hustling, penalized for trying to survive. Can't take a second job because then you won't qualify for SM housing. Also having a no pet rule for a house you bought is crazy. Please do better. People wonder why people are so depressed and defeated in this town.
- NOT NEARLY ENOUGH HOUSING FOR EMPLOYEES OF THE BUSINESSES HERE. HOW DO YOU EXPECT BUSINESSES TO OPERATE WHEN THERE AREN'T ENOUGH PLACES TO HOUSE THE WORKFORCE??
- Overall, TOSV does a great job building and managing employee housing.
- part time homeowners have to pay into a snowmass HOA, deed restricted homes should as well. we need more housing for people that want to live and work full time, but a lot of people beat the system and sublet. also seasonal workers tend to be more transient and not dedicated to the community, so skico should provide that kind of housing down valley.
- People that do not still qualify are allowed to remain in deed restricted housing
- Please build employee housing! No more mega hotels

- Rental units best.. owner occupied units often end up as second homes as the owners retire for the winter in Arizona..
- Requirements for continued occupancy are good, but I think the town falls short in making sure that owners comply with those rules. Enforcement has definitely gotten better in the past few years, and HOA's could do more to pass info to TOSV.
- Requirements for continued occupancy are not strictly enforced meaning there are owner units sitting empty or occupied by people not working. There are 20 plus individuals/families in each lottery who both live and work here and are deserving of the units that are not properly occupied.
- Residency enforcement should be enforced better. I know people who are gone much of the year, and are retired county employee and yet manages to keep his employee housing while others cannot find a home.
- Retired persons, living in larger homes, (4+bedrooms) in which those bedrooms remain unused, maybe consider offering those retired persons fabulous senior housing/neighborhoods with storage and yards. (Smaller homes but still in great neighborhoods with other retired friends!) It's not sustainable or affordable to continue building more and more subsidized large 4+ bedroom houses if there is never any movement. To honor the amazing service our retirees have given our community, we should help them move into senior housing neighborhoods that are beautiful and spacious but smaller, 2 bedrooms. Recycle the larger homes for the newer families who need the bedrooms. Again, storage and yards would be very important for the retired families.
- Senior housing at 8500 feet elevation and resort pricing? Does this make any sense at all? No, it doesn't! Where do you even get the notion that this is ok? Snow and ice is not necessarily safe for seniors, is it?
- Snowmass Housing Authority should require proof of employment via Tax Returns (IRS 1040) back to date of stated employment in SMV. The housing department currently only requires a letter from their employer stating when their employment began which is unsatisfactory.
- So grateful to have a studio at Mtn View! It could use some love and apparently it's on the way, 200 Bldg. Staff is great when there's a maintenance issue I can't resolve, quick and efficient. Office staff keeps us informed via email and physically posts important information where it can be seen.
- Special interest exceptions have been allowed and should not be. People have been able to skip the line to gain housing. People should have to submit w-2 form to prove employment in TOSV. This verification of employment should be shown yearly.
- Staff in the housing office does a great job at managing a difficult department. Polite, informed, responsive
- Stated previously
- The "rules" exist, but people taking over leases to avoid the waitlist needs to be stopped. I see it happening in Snowmass the most and it gives an unfair advantage to people who are will to cheat the system vs those who are trying to follow the rules.
- The amount of people who have gotten TOSV housing that no longer work within the Town. Makes it almost impossible for people who work in snowmass to be in snowmass. Single people deserve to have 2 bedrooms too. A couple tends to take up one bedroom and have a spare guest room.
- The big issue I have with the town housing is that single people can get 2 bedroom apartments. I understand that this was established during a time that the amount of single people looking for housing exceeded the amount of single rooms available, and there was a surplus of 2 bedrooms. However, there are a lot of families looking to buy 2 bedroom apartments, but they have to also compete with single people. I feel this should be revised.

- The focus on building deed-restricted single family homes is absurd. The focus should be on creating higher occupancy deed restricted housing. Land is such a valuable commodity and while the American dream is for a free standing home with a garage and a lawn, it is simply asking for too much. If you want that, then I believe you should move down valley. Accept living close to your neighbors and move to some place you can afford. It is just asking too much of the town.
- The HOA fees are far too high for what is offered and done for service and even kept in escrow for large maintenance items (such as replacing a roof for example). The HOA fees are in fact what kept my wife and I from going forward on entering the lottery for a 2-bedroom deed restricted unit. It made our monthly housing cost too high for our income/budget.
- The housing needs to be more aggressive at removing folks that aren't working in the Village and county fulltime to allow others opportunities for housing that are working.
- The housing ratio to the amount of job creating the development has done is out of balance, we need balance!!! we also need to improve the way the housing program is run. We as residents would also like to see where you plan on putting housing so we can understand the impacts. The housing issue is totally a TOSV created issue. The development of Base village and others have made it almost impossible to get employees because the jobs that were created are MORE than the housing. The TOSV needs to fix this ASAP.
- The housing up keep has gone down hill. Washers and dryers are ridiculously priced for the quality they are kept and the maintenance of the common parking and grounds is not maintained well
- The lottery process seems to be better than Apache however it's still difficult for people working in snowmass to get housing with a huge waiting list and the aging residency that is currently in those housing units. It seems like there is no roll off plan to bring in employees to the businesses that are growing and expanding in the community. Many people are coming from Silt! Although I do not currently live in snowmass housing the upkeep on the units I've been in have been atrocious. Carpeting and tiling from three occupants ago!
- The more new construction for second home owners, and "hot bed" units the more employee housing. What happened to building enough but not too much. I think you passed the too much a year ago and there are still plans for more. This is very poorly planned. There are not enough restaurants or shops for all the new occupants to Snowmass during peak ski season. Many restaurants can't afford to keep there doors open during off season because of lack of business. The holidays come and many establishments have just hired new employees. The town now has the people who have paid a lot for their vacation or property and they have high expectations of what their experience should be. Very difficult situation and opens the door for lots of discontent for visitors and then employees.
- The only reason there is significant need for more employee housing is because there is more development which requires more employees. More employees requires more housing. The town council said they would allow enough but not too much development and they have gone well beyond enough.
- The remodel has been an intrusive and disgusting process. The state of our units is very poor. Still lacks proper ventilation, the windows replaced have no screens and with the continued rain throughout the summer and long term water damage I don't know how there won't be mold and continued draining and humidity concerns in the future. I will be very disappointed if our rents will be raised after a year where our quiet enjoyment was affected with shoddy replacements and a rushed, poorly executed remodel.
- The system needs to be updated and changes made where necessary. Citizens can help with that process. There should be priority given to not only the amount of years/hours worked here but the amount of time lived here. Jobs may come and go but for those born here (for example) there

should be priority. For those who tried to work here but their work hours fluctuated, that should be a consideration. In general the purchasing price to purchase deed restricted is way too high. Only those with high paying jobs or some private support can offered to buy in. An example of that would be the high prices of single family homes at Horse Ranch. If the cost of building is too high, perhaps a simpler design should be in the works or considered. Emphasis should be placed on renting and not purchasing. You may purchase housing when you had a job here but then you work elsewhere and you still have the housing. Renting is way more changeable. You can't "kick" people out of their homes but their could be rules for renters. Their should be value placed on free market homeowners who are willing to rent to the workforce. Not everyone is out to get the visitor's dollars. Citizen input is paramount.

- There is an employee housing unit next to the Pokolodi Lodge, I think it should be sold to a developer and use the proceeds to build more employee housing at the Center development. This real estate is prime and could provide for greater number of units elsewhere. I know you are currently fixing the units, but this is just a band aid.
- There is no enforcement for people who are not following the deed restrictions.
- They did a great job on the remodels, but it's so dirty and we never get the stairs, walkways or windows washed.
- Tighter oversight of eligibility requirements.
- Too many people live in subsidized housing that own other housing properties outside the County. Subsidized housing should NOT be for the wealthy.
- We feel there should be forced downsizing or established rules or terms (There is no reason someone or a couple should occupy a 3 or 4 bedroom with grown kids). Make the re eligibility at least 3 years. We disagree with working for 10 years and being guaranteed housing for life.
- What are the possibilities of building employee housing, just outside the town, in the two or three deep valleys on the left side of Brush Creek Road?
- Whatever decisions are made with regard to affordable housing, they should be actually defining affordable in relation to the salary of the average worker in the area. A million dollar condo isn't affordable to most workers. If not addressed in an equitable and conscious manner, the area will find itself unable to recruit and maintain an ample and quality workforce
- Wish we had snow removal on the weekends
- Worker housing should be for Snowmass Village workers. Lack of foresight on this issue has turned worker housing into retired housing and housing for people who don't use it year round.

Q16. OPTIONAL: Do you have any comments about the services provided by the Community Development Department that you would like to share?

- Again, the fees are excessive for a simple site visit (roof replacement). Getting permits through the town was easy, getting approval through Romero Group TOSV HOA was unreasonably slow and difficult to work with.
- Great reputation, especially compared to Aspen
- I wish someone would have a more global long term view of our village. Not just short term money making view.
- Mike and Sara are awesome to work with.
- More staffing would improve the timeliness
- Past experiences have been wonderful (4-10 years ago)
- please make it easy for people to make fire safe and climate friendly changes to their homes such as safe roofs, tree trimming/removal, solar power and EV charging. please do not approve poorly designed or cheaply made homes. it will worsen property values and deteriorate over time. please protect public view corridors. how those 2 modern homes ever got approved on owl creek road east of the little red schoolhouse is unfathomable. they block the view of Daly and should have NEVER been approved. that should really be investigated, as the original rules prohibited such structures and someone did something to get around it. keep open areas and views protected.
- Require more parking : at least 1.5 per bedroom..
- Some regulations need to be instituted and put into law to restrict the planting of trees that will grow so high as to obstruct views of homeowners. When we bought our home we had fabulous views of Mt. Daly that have now been obliterated by the growth of huge pine and Aspen trees. The planning commission is supposed to govern this but have no power to do anything to the neighbors who are doing this planting w/o regard for the consequences on surrounding properties.
- Thanks for prompt communication and quick inspection.
- THE CONSTRUCTION ON WOOD ROAD IS AWFUL! IT DIMINISHES THE VALUE OF STAYS AT THE BUSINESSES ALONG WOOD ROAD AND HAS DEGRADED THE VALUE OF THE PROPERTIES. GUESTS HAVE CONTINUALLY COMPLAINED ABOUT THE CONSTRUCTION NOISE AND NUISANCE FOR THE PAST 2 YEARS AND IT HAS HURT OUR BUSINESS.
- The issue is with all the HOAs. 2 levels for every area is burdensome.
- We are working with contractors on getting a permit to do construction so we don't have enough experience yet to address these questions
- While it's still better than Aspen and Pitkin, it feels the new department is trying to be more like them, please don't. Keep things simple.

Q23. OPTIONAL: Do you have any comments about the services provided by the Public Works Department that you would like to share?

- 1. Too many signs. 2. Need to remove the flashing beacons or get people to use them all of the time.
- A more permanent and maintained trail should be cut from the cul-du-sac on N Ridge LN down to the Village Way paved trail. There is a gas pipeline cut (at least I think that's what's there) along the route that already has a makeshift path. That path should be improved and maintained.
- Access to the bike paths along Brush Creek could be improved for people to see and use them more
- Although the flashing lights at the Town Park Station crosswalk are very helpful, I'm surprised nobody has been hit. Too many people are flying down Brush Creek Road and fail to stop or even notice that the lights are flashing. On top of this, most people who are crossing are very ignorant of the traffic and push the button, start walking without hesitation, expecting traffic to stop.
- Although the small roundabout at wood road does not have many accidents, I do find it to be a point of frustration between ALL users. More sidewalks would prevent people from walking on streets from bus stops. I feel the bus stops are the biggest place they are needed but there are other access points that don't involve roads to get to other places asked like the far-away to wood road. The snow removal needs to be better especially if you can barely get around without sliding with studs and 4wheel drive. I think the way of composting could be rethought, however composting in general is a good idea. I don't know that the passing lanes would be the greatest ideas however a pullout wouldn't be horrible when there is slow traffic or some legislation that says if there are 4 cars behind you to pull over... like Montana has. If you are going to go with passing lanes make them more efficient and effective the one going into snowmass village on brush creek
- Automated flashing light by Mountain View across brush creek. Just like at faraway and Sinclair.
- Best winter road maintenance in the valley.
- Bike paths could be maintained better. Stop signs and rumble strips by tennis courts and Black Saddle should be removed and replaced with Yield and speed limit signs. These are the most stupid Stop signs anywhere.
- Bikers--We have spent millions of dollars on Bike Lanes and yet some bikers decide NOT TO USE THEM and determine to ride down the middle of the road used for cars and trucks. Since there is a double line, the bikers know we cannot pass them. Once I attempted to do this on Owl Creek Rd. towards Aspen and was cursed at and given the "finger". SIGNS SHOULD BE ERECTED STATING NO BIKERS ALLOWED ON ROADS USED FOR CARS AND IT SHOULD BE STATED THAT BIKE LANES ARE TO BE USED.
- Brush creek at Upper Woodbridge is an issue
- Brush Creek Rd.-Wood Rd. to Mountain View AND Brush Creek Rd.-Mountain View to Snowmass Mall. I commonly see locals walking the road on these routes. While the other locations seem like great use-cases for sidewalks, I don't commonly see folks walking there. It feels like the bike path is a close enough route that people will use it.
- Carriage way wood rd. Traffic circle need to put yield signs in more visible places.
- Cars are NOT stopping at Crosswalks. More enforcement is needed. Crosswalks markings on the roadway are needed at Brush Creek Rd and Brush Creek Ped Path crossing. Cars are driving fast with no intent to stop. Same at upper Low Line trail and Owl Creek road. Most crosswalks need flashing lights. Our bike paths are in horrible condition.

- Cars heading down Wood Road towards the mini roundabout have NO IDEA that it's a roundabout. A flashing light or something needs to be put up on Wood Road to protect drivers on Carriage Way using the roundabout as it should be used.
- Confused on questions asking for support to construct pedestrian walkways in the above questions. They all already exist. Just need better signage maybe.
- Current paths are not used. Why build more. Mountain View to Mall seems appropriate given the amount of pedestrians/work staff walking to work.
- Good at cleaning up bear skat but useless in addressing written safety concerns.
- Great work guys! You do a great job keeping up with the needs of the village
- how can there not be a flashing crosswalk at the fire station? assume ambulance is close when people get hit?
- I believe that if you increase the number of people who live here and the infrastructure to properly create the environment they require, it has an exponential effect on creating more needs. In other words Dick Lamm was right. If you build more infrastructure or try to attract more people, the system fills to just beyond capacity and starts again. Let's focus on improving the quality of what we have.
- I don't know why but the flashing pedestrian crossing at Brush Creek and Sinclair is not effective enough. Vehicles don't see it? As a pedestrian it's always a 50/50 to wait and see if they see it? They are affective at other intersections but this one needs more help.
- I find it appalling that TOSV allows for curbside trash pick up in Horse Ranch and on Fairway Drive. This directly contradicts all of the effort that TOSV puts into protecting wildlife. How do we as a community allow this to happen? TOSV needs to stand up to the residents of these two subdivisions and discontinue this archaic practice! Build a dumpster shed at the bottom of Horse Ranch Drive and at the top of Fairway Drive. There is plenty of real estate in both of those locations. Also, while I currently use the central drop-off location for compost at the Town Shop, I know that many more people would compost if it were more convenient (i.e. multiple compost drops throughout the Village).
- I find it interesting Composting services were mixed with Evergreen Xero Waste and now the Town is looking to provide this service for an additional amount. Really?
- I like the idea of more pedestrian walkways, but doesn't the bike path cover much of that area?
- I live near the Faraway/Woodbridge/Brush Creek area and I think we should have a sidewalk from the uphill bus drop-off at Faraway to Woodbridge Road. walking on that shoulder in the winter is sketchy. ... Also, as more development comes to Base Village and more traffic, this section is going to be even more difficult to get onto Brush Creek. thanks for the flashing ped crossings there a few years back.
- I love having the compost dumpster. This is amazing. Thank you!!! I do not think compost dumpsters are necessary at every dumpster shed.
- I miss the electronics dumpster
- I selected 'don't know' for reduced speed limits because I am not sure they will be enforced adequately
- I support the sidewalk, but we already have the paths above the road. our visitors just don't know they're there. Public works does a good job.
- I think the mini roundabout is dangerous and that there should be a stop sign on Carriage Way instead. The Owl Creek and Brush Creek intersection gets very backed up during our town's rush hour times in the summer and winter (9am/3pm) for camps and skiing. Perhaps a regular sized round about would be helpful there. I'm looking forward to the Meadow Ranch/Fairway 3 bus stop move and the cross walk (hopefully with flashing lights) that will be put in place for the

increased number of families with school aged children that live in the surrounding neighborhoods.

- Is recycling actually recycled?
- It is extremely difficult and dangerous to turn left from Faraway rd. to go to bank , grocery store, doctors , anywhere. There is also a sheet of ice at the bottom of Faraway rd. making it difficult to stop at the stop sign. Sliding people into oncoming traffic on brush creek rd.
- it is time to stop deliberating on a roundabout at owl creek and brush creek. that is the worst intersection in Snowmass Village. its dangerous, traffic backs up on owl creek at times, drivers are either too aggressive or don't know what they are doing holding up traffic. please address ASAP
- It would be nice to have benches at the Brush Creek & Wood Rd bus stops.
- I've watched tourists nearly get run over at stop signs, etc. And I've watched tourists try to walk in the middle of the road to get to their destination. I think more pedestrian-friendly areas are needed.
- keep up the good work
- mini roundabout doesn't work. I'd never pull out in front of someone even though I'd have the right of way. I think just go back to a 3 way intersection with a stop sign for downhill traffic on Carriage Way- let up and downhill traffic on Wood Rd have the right of way.
- More signs indicating pedestrian walkways/trails for tourists so they don't walk on the roads.
- Most areas asked about sidewalks already have existing trails/ sidewalks
- Not the fault of public works that traffic has increased beyond what out town can handle.
- Pedestrian lights must be on a longer base and brighter--drivers don't see it.
- Pedestrian trail higher to WRV on Wood road. SO MANY walk that and it is dangerous and very busy area
- People have turned Brush creek into a speed way and ignore pedestrian cross walks. You need to find ways to slow them down particularly when they are on the straightway up to the village.
- Please don't add medians. Very distracting as a driver and harder to see pedestrians. Who sets the blinking light time for the crosswalks? Always seems too long. We might have to evaluate bike path vs more sidewalks. Doesn't feel safe to walk on bike paths always with ebikes, but we definitely don't want the ebikes on the roads!!!
- please widen Oak Ridge Road - NOT because we want cars to drive faster, but because we want cars to stay on pavement and not have to pull off pavement/into shoulders and ditches just to pass an oncoming vehicle. Many cars get stuck when having to pull off the pavement
- Portable traffic light at Owl Creek/Brush creek intersection during busy periods (traffic flow study to determine what Busy Period would be). Definitely would not support an expensive roundabout at that intersection
- Public works is helping w/speed control & its greatly appreciated!
- Regarding waste pick up, it is still obvious that homeowners pay for the service but many random people from other areas drive by and use the service. I do not have a solution, just an observation. Therefore higher prices for new services does not seem appropriate until this issue is resolved. There should be a pedestrian walk way painted across the road at Meadow Road and Brush Creek Road (by the dumpsters) This section of crossing is used to access the bus and the walking/biking trail. This walk way has been requested in the past but it has not been implemented. This crosswalk is ESSENTIAL.
- Roads department is outstanding. Thank you, John Baker.
- Roundabout at Wood & Carriage needs to be bigger and more built out.
- Seeing pedestrians on brush creek (the big turn coming into the mall) in the winter is going to result in an accident, guaranteed.

- Should return the dumpster location on Wood road - even if near / in Base Village. .
- So, if the town wants to move towards more composting, then the ordinance not allowing outside agencies to pick up trash needs to be amended. Currently, the town does not allow the composting trash services to operate within town limits because it is not allowed per the ordinance. In addition, if you try to have your compost picked up by them, the waste department contacts you to inform you that you are in violation. I don't think it is ideal to add a compost pickup service to the town responsibilities instead would prefer the town allows composting pickup from a private company and allows them to utilize the bear-proof dumpster buildings. I realize that has the potential to create some damage to those buildings but would argue that it would be less of a hassle than the town assuming the responsibility of compost pickup. thanks
- some of these are currently connected by Bike and Walking paths. These are not well maintained and many people do not know they exist. It will all depend on how they walk ways are designed because the roundabout at Wood Road and Carriage is not good at all. It is made even further difficult when the directions of how to use seem to be continually changing.
- Speed bumps like those at the Woody Creek Tavern might be highly desirable to slow traffic down.
- Strongly support pedestrian pathways, sidewalks or lanes. I would really like to see more folks seeing the village as a pedestrian safe and efficient way to get around. We have the elevation changes which make getting around more challenging than the Aspen core but I believe folks would be more willing to walk if they can see the way as apposed to walking on the shoulder of the busy Brush Creek, Owl Creek, Faraway, Wood Rd and even Ridge Rd.
- thank you for putting in the stairs in from mountain view to brush creek--makes a HUGE difference!
- The annual bill for trash/solid waste is very high, and it comes in off season when income is limited. I would love to break that bill into halves or quarters, rather than one big one once a year.
- The bike path crossing at Brush Creek Rd at Ditch line trail should be painted and have flashing light for pedestrian/cycling right of way . Same for Owl Creek out of Tom Blake Parking lot to Highline Trail. Both are very dangerous for pedestrians and cyclists.
- The carriage way round about should be a stop sign. It's very confusing and kind of dangerous. No one knows how to properly use it
- The current paved pathways/trails should all be maintained before any new additions.
- The excessive charge for garbage use of the dumpster should be absorbed by the town thru general fund
- The existing town bike/pedestrian trail system (Brush Creek, Owl Creek, Melton Ranch, etc.) functions well in place of dedicated sidewalks.
- The horrible mangling of roadside shrubs and vegetation last fall on Oak Ridge, Sinclair, Faraway roads was a big mistake and the mitigation of this eyesore has been slow and incompletely handled. Extra brush, limbs, and debris has been left alongside these roads and is a constant eyesore to those of us who previously enjoyed walking and biking daily on the roads. The work is waiting to be completed so please get it together before the snow flies and fix the mess you made. Thank you.
- The intersection at owl creek and brush creek is crazy dangerous at night during the season with people walking across clad in winter black. Can't we offer them a welcome gift package with neon light sticks or flashlights when they arrive in SMV?
- The mini roundabout is useless and often unsafe as drivers do not treat it as a roundabout. No more roundabouts are needed and stop signs work fine.

- The mini roundabout on Wood Rd is a joke and the worst possible solution for that location. Nobody ever stops coming down Wood Rd and I can't believe there haven't been any accidents. TOSV shuttle drivers are probably the worst.
- The proposed roundabout at Brush Creek Road and Owl Creek Road is a sound solution only if there is a "slip lane" coming off of Brush onto Owl.
- The public works department is the best! The snowplow service is the best in the country! Employees are all friendly, courteous and efficient.
- The rapid flashing beacons are great additions. A crosswalk at Meadow Rd would be great.
- the streets are really bad. too many pot holes. need roundabout at owl creek and brush creek. unsafe and takes so long. potentially pedestrian bridge also.
- the town just stopped composting from our homes by a wonderful SMALL business , now you are asking if the town should do it???? thought it was a bear issue.
- The trails and paths are very much appreciated. I'm confused why you're asking about sidewalks on brush creek and faraway / owl creek/ wood road when the path by the creek already exists... So left those unanswered
- There are plenty of walking trails in place to navigate the village by foot. We don't need more sidewalks where there are already trails in place.
- There needs to be a cross walk at Brush Creek and Meadow Road. Paving needs to be extended from the entrance of the Rec Center to Horse Ranch Drive on the south bound side. There are 2 small sections entering and exiting the uphill bus pullout that are two pinch points for cyclists. Brush Creek Road needs to be wider from the Rec Center to Owl Creek Road for cyclists. The width of the paving through the Town Park Station area on Brush Creek road needs to be wider overall for cycling.
- They are nice people and very friendly(due to small community)
- they're awesome
- Traffic lights save lives
- Unfortunately, bikers, for the most part, don't utilize side walks or bike paths so no need to construct more for them to use!
- Unfortunately, human nature is at play...stops signs work great IF people actually stop at them. The flashing lights at crosswalks are extremely helpful to notify drivers of pedestrians IF the pedestrians actually push the button. Not a dig at the Public Works folks, I'm all for these safety measures, just wish the users of the roads were more sensible
- Very high opinion of Public Works employees
- Walkways listed above already exist and they are not along the road which is pleasant. A flashing light crosswalk is needed at Brush Creek Road and Meadow Road. Anybody and everybody dumps their trash at Meadow and Brush Creek Rd bins and residents pay for it. The recent closing and locking door devices don't work well. The boards warp and are difficult to open and close.
- We already have walking and bike paths in many of these locations that need to be updated and made more pleasant to be on. There is no landscaping or wildflowers to enhance to make the areas more appealing. The town seems to have no interest in beautifying the town's appearance. It is very sad to go to other communities in the Roaring Fork Valley and seeing what the other towns are doing to enhance the beauty of what has been done due to development. We don't even get any kind of commitment for art installations or landscaping. A real shame!
- We have pedestrian walkways but many people are unaware or unwilling to walk the steps to use them, instead walking on the roads. There certainly needs to be more enforcement of dog leash laws, as consistently dog owners are not keeping their pets in control creating unsafe conditions for other users on the paths.

- We have to do something better about the mini round about even if it a traffic light
- We need a button activated flashing cross walk by the fire station. Not only is the speed limit 35 mph passed the fire station and through one of the busiest crosswalks for walkers and dogs, but the cross walk is on a large corner where absolutely no one stops. It is remarkable that no one has been killed there.
- What about the intersection at owl creek rd and high line rd, could we at least get a 2nd lane to make a right to go onto high line towards the Tom Blake Parking and over owl creek rd? And what about drivers going 20 miles under the speed limit?? Really, some of us ain't on vacation! Do they get tickets for driving too slow, how about pulling over and then continue your joy ride?
- When you are a pedestrian coming from Woodbridge there is no way that makes you feel to safe. Yes, there is the trail (can't remember the name), but it can be hard to find. Especially at night
- While yield signs, speed limited etc. are designed to calm traffic, I've seen people widely disregard them. Shape of road, speed bumps and offsets (like in crested butte) force speed control and are better ways to control traffic law adherence
- Woodbridge - the actual bridge - needs updating/support and more lights that work; also the walking/bike use trail behind Upper Woodbridge condominiums up/behind leading to Martingale need MASSIVE UPDATING - they're falling APART - 20 year asphalt is falling down the hill - supports holding back the hill are collapsing - please take a look !!
- Y'all do a great job!! I would love if you could do tours and show us our infrastructure and the wonderful people behind it.
- Yes I would like to see a safe crossing option from Mountain View to brush creek trail for a stroller or someone in a wheelchair. And underpass or sidewalk and flashing crosswalk.
- You need to move the bus stop or enforce that walking people cross at the cross walk at the mini round-about. People get off the bus top on Brish Creek and cross all over the place making it extremely likely someone is going to get run over. The people cross with about a line of 10 people wide or just walk out in front of cars when they are not to the actual cross walk.

- doing a great job
- Enforce not stopping at ped crossings. Lower ALL Speed Limits in Town. Especially at entry and Owl Creek Roads.
- Excellent Police Department!!
- Excellent service
- Firm believer that most policing issues can be caught upstream of the enforcement routine. Overfunding of police and too much police presence does not make a community "safer" - if a community does not feel safe there are other questions to ask before solutioning that more police solves the issue.

Snowmass and the Aspen Ski Company are supposed to be environmentally proactive. The busses are not electric and run empty at least 1/2 of the year on low ridership routes. Plus now the price of gas is significant.

Q31. OPTIONAL: Do you have any comments about the services provided by the Transportation and Parking Department that you would like to share?

- A structured parking system needs to be in place in the summer. Guests can't find parking during Thursday Nights. Lots should be used for lodging and not car campers. Hard to enforce car camping without association to lodging.
- Again, we don't have enough parking to support all the development.
- Already answered.
- As mentioned above some large or medium buses empty or near empty on some routes. Smaller bus for the Snowmass Club route? Can't have too many buses for special events like Music in the Town park, Rodeo, Wine festival, etc. but thank you for what is provided.
- Availability in upper lots is limited when people don't park properly or clear their vehicles of snow and ice.
- Base Village doesn't have good access unless parking in garage.
- Better shuttle connection from RFTA to Two Creeks for employees (especially on weekends) and skiers
- Bus start too late in the morning.
- During Special Events parking should be more enforced.
- During the ski season, many people parking in the Rodeo lot park outside the boundaries infringing on the lanes for negotiating the parking lot, creating dangerously narrow lanes for driving thru the parking lot. Stricter enforcement and towing might result in greater compliance.
- Fines are too high....and enforcement is so arbitrary and inconsistent
- Fiscal year for parking permits could be more random. That would help alleviate the rush before Thanksgiving.
- Folks in the office are very friendly and helpful.
- get that mall transit thing built!
- I am a regular lot user. My condo has a 1 vehicle policy, so one of the two cars we own is parked in a town lot. Last winter I saw camping and vehicles that were way beyond the parking time limit allowed to take up room in lots before being removed. I always obey the posted regulations, and I expect others to as well because space is limited. Once year-round paid permits go into effect, I will have a much higher expectation of enforcement. I am definitely all for year-round fees for that reason.
- I do have concerns about vehicles parked overnight/camping Town Park parking lot. While I do not have any issues with campers in general, it does seem like a safety issue to have unregistered overnighters with so many kids accessing the Rec center and playground areas. It hasn't been as bad this summer as last, but I definitely still see vans and out of state vehicles that are there overnight.
- I like resident parking passes availability for parking
- I think the newly planned bus depot at the Mall is poorly planned and very unsightly. Snowmass and the Aspen Ski Company promote themselves as environmentally pro active yet we do not have electric buses and they drive around empty during many times of the year. There should be signs at certain bus stops that provide a number to call for service and make them on call during low seasonal occupancy. We see buses driving around empty and they have been nick named ghost buses for lack of passengers.
- I would be willing to pay more to be able to park my car where I work. I am a fulltime single mom, I cannot take a bus to my kids if there is an emergency-there is no one else to help my kids
- I would like to see free parking passes for permanent residents

- I would like to see more routes go up by mountain view and creekside, it seems like only 2 go that way all the others go up snowmelt.
- I'd love to keep as many cars off the road as possible, so some kind of incentive to ride the bus would be HUGE... i.e. free basket of fries, beer, soda, candy bar or hot coco up top
- I'm a full time resident. For instance this week was jazz aspen and I couldn't even park in my lot because people that don't live here were parking there. Very inconvenient.
- If you have to be at work at 6am in the town there is no transportation. People working at hotels or for breakfast have to figure out ways to get to work.
- In winter town park fills up with construction workers vehicles. Construction companies should find parking on their construction sites and leave room at the town park for tourist parking to go skiing
- Make it easier for guests to park in the winter. It's about a guest experience and getting a \$60 ticket for accidentally giving their front desk one incorrect digit does nothing good for the perception of the community and the guest facing workers are the ones receiving all the vitriol. Work better with the lodges that host guests paying for parking spots and don't write them off when they come to the parking department with issues directly relating to parking department services.
- More enforcement in lot 6 in the winter especially in the handicap spots and taxi stand
- More visible and/or easily accessible public information/signage for guests (and even valley residents outside of Snowmass) who drive up here and have no understanding of our parking system. There is definitely a need for more parking in the winter time with skier traffic but then again there is a need for more people to use public transportation. We also need to make sure that these new large-scale residential developments have adequate parking to accommodate the numbers that they draw in. I think the # lots get misused in the summertime without any permitting system or regulation of access, but it is also a benefit to the local community to be able to use the lots for access to recreation, events, and local businesses.
- Need at least one full-time year-round parking person, but really need more than that. There needs to be a presence from the parking department at special events (like Thursday night concerts).
- Need better information of seasonal changes to bus routes frequency.
- need to eliminate the allowance for non employees or residents ability to purchase season parking passes [Gold/Senior] we have the rodeo lot and free bus for them
- Only Suggestion is to crack down on the people that purchase multiple parking passes to "sell" to people in Aspen so they can park in the upper lots. I uphill 4 days a week during winter and I hear people bragging about what they do.
- Our parking situation in lots 1-12 is a mess. too many tourist cars that I think we encourage by letting the Viewline and condos have as much parking as possible in those lots. also we need more parking enforcement, higher violation fees, enforce the no overnight camping (I see people waking up in their camper vans as I go to work at 7am at the mall), and tow cars out of there faster. Those lots should be Snowmass resident permit or fee lots. there is no reason SMV needs to have free parking all summer these are the same tourist that pay \$6/hr. in Aspen. give your residents and owners a benefit through the residence permit. Encourage less tourist cars. this needs to be addressed ASAP.
- Parking in the summer should remain free. Village shuttles tends to be really hot in the summer.
- Parking in the upper village is often at capacity. This is more of a marketing problem than an infrastructure problem. It seems as if Snowmass is in the early stages of a capacity problem with degradation of guest and resident experience already in progress.

- Parking is usually okay for us unless there is a special event. Then parking is not good at all, and we will frequently choose to not go to an event because there is not enough parking.
- Parking of long term vehicles in numbered lots during events and in winter should not be allowed. Closing numbered lots because too many people drove a rented car to the village to stay. Plowing in the winter in numbered lots need to be done earlier in the morning before permitted cars arrive.
- People parking on roads seems to be limited in enforcement. Too lax in letting people park their vehicles in town roadways.
- Please don't build the boondoggle bus depot. It provides very little for a whole lot of cash. Stop letting the budget burn a hole in your pocket...
- Please make a locals parking pass available to anyone in the Valley even without the Snowmass Village zip.
- please provide more EV parking and wider spaces as most people drive big cars. better signage to let tourists know to ride on the PATH next to owl creek NOT on the road. so dangerous.
- Please resume local busses through Creekside & Brush Creek Apartments
- Previously stated, the base village seems to be taking over, including the parking garage. They do what they want and is not always great quality or pipes break etc. Information on brochures needs updated and the transit app although works great everywhere else throughout the valley, is hard to interpret in Snowmass.
- Route #3 is very hard to rely on. It is either late or early every single time. Had to purchase a bicycle because it is not reliable.
- Run small buses when no or few riders... too often see large, empty buses during the off season and during slow periods. .
- Shuttle does not go up (to a reasonable way) Faraway Rd. Parking: there is no parking at trailheads when it appears it could be figured out. Or parking to catch the shuttle.
- shuttles rock
- Thankless job. But thank you
- The #3 should go to Brush Creek and the Transit hub at Town Park. This is more efficient for all users, especially utilizing Two Creeks as an alternate place to pick up and drop off. The distance, time and cost would be minimal. If I work or live at the Snowmass Club I have to grab #3 then transfer to the Town Park bus. We can do better by closing this loop
- The best service.
- The future for the Snowmass Center re-development looks pretty grim for parking availability. People just using the Post Office daily need adequate parking, The number of people using existing parking all day while they ski or bike is not acceptable. Limited time parking might solve that.
- The new plans to reduce parking at Town Park is a terrible decision and does not solve any problems, it just creates more. It is essential that parking be allowed on the new rodeo surface in the winter, otherwise the Town should buck up and be down there on the weekends when the parking is full and the poor ASC employees have to deal with the upset locals.
- The parking under the base is just the worst!!! That's why we avoid going there
- The Snowmass Shuttle is a great service!
- The town clearly needs more parking for residents. Any significant town event has inadequate parking and messages go out that lots are full well before the event. Even with a parking pass in the winter, it can be difficult to find a place to park.
- The town desperately needs more parking/lots/spots. What we available now for visitors and workers is embarrassing.

- The Village shuttle should operate until the last RFTA bus arrives in the Village. Dial-a-ride is insufficient.
- There's not enough parking because there are too many people coming here
- Too hard to ride the bus. Stop at faraway road - every bus comes uphill at the same time and there are too many routes. I don't have time to go on a tour of the village on my way to work - I want to get where I'm going.
- Too much affordable and available parking leads to overuse of single-occupancy vehicles.
- Transportation Department does an Excellent Job !!!
- Transportation needs to pay more attention to ecology and environmental concerns.
- Transportation seems adequate. Town shuttle is a great service that we use a lot
- Using Town Parking Lots for Car Storage should be prohibited
- We are very fortunate to have the best Transportation department in the valley
- We are very grateful for the shuttle system
- We need better bike racks on *all* the village busses!
- We walk up daily from bottom of fairway dr to mall or center, and shuttle back. We love EVERYTHING about the shuttle! Just wish more locals would use them! If you could further limit parking options for visitors, that would be great.
- What is up with the lame construction this fall causing a huge constant cluster for Owl Creek Rd? Just make a roundabout at the intersection of Brush Creek and Owl Creek and stop closing it down. Transportation power trip!!!
- Wish the shuttle would go later on weekends.
- Would like the Horse Ranch Shuttle to go further up Horse Ranch.
- You're all doing an amazing job

Q35. OPTIONAL: Do you have any comments about or suggestions for the services provided by the Tourism Department?

- 90% of the special events doesn't bring anything to local restaurant, bars, shops, etc.. Profit is only made by hotels and short term rental owners. Majority of events bring crowd that either can't afford to dine in in local restaurants or complain about prices and rates. Thursday night concert is just wasting of tax money since it brings very little to restaurant and shops in the Snowmass mall (drinks sold at the concert by vendors and guest are allowed to bring their own food). All events that were held this year had food and beverage vendors oppose to make people shop and dine at local restaurants and bars, and that is what is actually killing local economy. Most special events that were held this and past years are not worth tax money spent on them since those events don't generate enough high profile crowd that can spend enough money so event can pay for itself through tax money.
- Clarification on summer events: it's not really too much, however, I feel we should pick our strongest events and do them bigger/better, some of the smaller events are lack-luster and dollars/efforts can be out toward bigger weekend festivals. Concert series is a must and should be expanded (seems like when I first moved here 2002, there were more weeks ?)
- Do we actually see an uptick in revenue for hotels/local business's (except for perhaps the grocery store) during events like Ragnar and other events that allow usage of the Town Park/ ASE all field for tents/camping? Is there actual tracking for how these events realistically drive revenue. It seems to me that they do more damage to the spaces/cause consternation to people utilizing these spaces. This might even include the Rodeo grounds. Couldn't we make more soccer/lacrosse spaces and involve Snowmass in broader regional tournaments that yield rentals of rooms/dining in restaurants particularly in the shoulder seasons and the summer when their is capacity. Move the Rodeo to the intercept lot/Cozy point where horses/equestrian style spaces already are established.
- Enough. We are feeling more like Vail every year.
- Events should end on time to respect noise restrictions and respect the community.
- Fewer events in the summer and fall. A bit overrun, and so many road closures (may be amplified by the soul-crushing year of construction) more events that focus on hotel stays/ revenue. What does Ragnar bring to the town except tents? And can we take down the damn posters on the lampposts? They are usually in the way - and why spend money advertising Snowmass to people who are already here? Seriously, how many signs / distractions are there in the wood creek/ brush creek roundabout already?????
- Give their budget to housing dept.
- Have a more cohesive message, have more predictable (reliably predictable) annual events (e.g., Fanny Hill concerts, Balloon Festival), plus better distinguish SV from Aspen.
- I am a local children's entertainer. TOSV hired me but one time this entire summer. If we are a family oriented resort, we should have regular entertainment for children, especially since you have several local children's entertainers in Snowmass Village. They built momentum with many families in previous years, and completely destroyed it by not continuing this year. I sent everyone to Aspen this year when they asked me where to go. That's just silly.
- I am not sure how many people go to the websites but most look in the papers. The ski company has an excellent for of advertising by doing blast emails.
- I avoid the mountain whenever there is a special event in the summer.
- I don't particularly like Ragnar...seems like they take a lot of town resources but don't contribute much to the town...but I don't know what TOSV charges the event. I also don't particular like

Tough Mudder type competitions. They seem disrespectful to the mountain and don't clean up all their way finding signs but I recall that it has been a couple of years since we have had one of those type events, maybe intentional, maybe COVID related?

- I don't think SMV needs to be spending much money on advertising our town. Aspen is a zoo which is why we wanted to buy and live in Snowmass. Keep it that way. Aspen Ski Co does enough marketing
- I think our governor nailed it by saying, we don't need to increase tourism in this state. We have what we can sustain and now need to take more care to cultivate what we have. Also, utilizing funds collected from lodging to fund the housing department. Admittedly, I don't know where our lodging taxes go.
- I'd say provide more sporting special events, but this would involve a Town Park redesign, which our friends at the rodeo won't seem to let happen...
- If the tax revenues are expanded to also fund housing, please ensure that a significant enough portion of the budget is invested in tourism to support our economy.
- if the Tourism Department handles Fanny Hill concerts: thumbs up except for food and beverage services 2022. Beverages expensive and inconvenient. Survey of friends say they (we) would pay a small cover charge to improve that aspect, or return to "old days" of bring your own.
- Instagram and Facebook
- It seemed in the past the events mainly revolved around music and alcohol. The last few seasons there were events not involving music and alcohol (bike races, running races, baseball tournament, volleyball, obstacle courses, etc.) I hope that trend continues, these type of events appear to benefit more businesses than the music and alcohol events.
- It seems like the Rec center is always used I the summer weekends.
- It seems that seasonal resort communities are realizing that they have been discovered and don't have to put so much effort into marketing and should be putting more effort into community building. I appreciate that and think Snowmass should work on developing an identity outside of tourism. I fully understand that tourism is the bread and butter but the community is the foundational plate and knife.
- It would be really nice to have one place to find local events. There are commonly events I don't know are happening until day-off because our events calendars aren't synced or kept up to date
- Keep it going. The more events the better, gives residents choices that far exceed what would be available in towns 100 times the size of ours. A vibrant event and cultural trade gives us the restaurants, shopping and a vibrancy that makes Snowmass special. Tourism drives the community, providing activity and a vibe.
- Keep the Rodeo viable - with enough parking / exercise area for cowboys, their horses, trailers, etc.
- Less Summer events. Encouraging rates at Hotels for these events over of STR's with more options for camping. The STR's for these events really impact the residential "community" negatively.
- Make the rodeo arena a covered year round event arena. Bring in concerts, circus, demonstrations, cooking shows, gymnastic events, hockey, indoor soccer/lacrosse. There is so much you could do with an indoor arena like that. It would bring more guests to these huge hotels in SMV, what are you waiting for?
- More events for Latino community
- More music. Fill the valley between the peaks. More small and medium sized events, between the larger events.
- Much too much! Redirect marketing/tourism tax to workforce housing.
- No, I think y'all do a great job!

- Please bring back the kids entertainment for the kids and their families.
- please provide more activities for teens. please provide more camps for teens. please provide more activities and camps at the rec center. it's way underutilized for teens year round. art and sports and tech are missing. all they have is fencing and basketball. should have some drop in games and camps.
- Please stop bringing more events that involve alcohol and do not support any businesses except for the bars. The tourism department should be more involved with their events and hold people accountable for not following permits (this includes the tourism department). If you can't handle the amount of events you bring in, then stop bringing them in. The town's infrastructure cannot handle the amount of people coming and the locals are getting tired of hearing the rowdy late night crowds after the events are done. Bring in more family friendly events and daytime events that are not drunken fests.
- Posters may help get out the info?
- Posters only when appropriate. I think the overall marketing of special events is very poor.
- Quit packing every weekend in the summer with events/multiple events!!!! Summer is overcrowded. Just us the summers back.
- Represent all the stake holders equally.
- Sales and group marketing budget seems very high. Also, it seems unnecessary to be spending large amounts of the tourism budget to bring in more people when we are overcrowded at certain times of the year.
- Scale it back
- Ski co seems to have too much influence over the tourism board.
- Slow down with the marketing blitz that is eroding the character of our home town. Does anyone who works for Snowmass Tourism actually live in the Village? Their job is to get people to come here, and they have been successful at that. Now, it is up to TOSV to decide when enough is enough. Remember COVID, and the Summer of 2020? We did not have any events (or very few at the most). People came here. They hiked and bikes and camped and spent money. 30 years ago, we needed a robust approach to marketing the Village. Now we are a known quantity. While I do not think that we should completely stop marketing, I think we should definitely slow down and re-evaluate. We also have so many summertime events that town staff literally cannot manage them.
- spend more money on upgrading things for every day use instead of one off events
- The events department rules!
- The information that the tourism department does not usually align with that of ski co. They should do more research and partnership with the company. Many people go to the resort with information and packets from the tourism department that is outdated, misleading and wrong. Things change and most of the resources I've seen need more alignment. I cannot express how many people have come to my place of business and told me how I was wrong! The tourism department is the front face and needs to be more aligned.
- The question above is not worded properly. The fact is that information is not shared well and is difficult to find. Let people know where the latest invasion is happening so we can avoid the crowds! GoSnowmass.com never has current/updated info. It SHOULD be the place to get info, but it's terrible. Stop spending money to lure more tourists to a place that is already overrun by tourists. We don't have enough locals to serve all of the tourists, so STOP! What a waste of money -To keep paying people to work for a Tourism Department - we don't need you to facilitate constant large groups that overwhelm the community/workforce.

- The Tourism Dept should ensure that the special events they bring into town actually drum up business for local establishments, rather than allow these gatherings to hire or bring their own services with them or give the business to Aspen Ski Co.
- The town is "sold" enough. Summer often feels as though it does not belong to the locals. Dial back the promotion. Does anyone really think we need more people here?
- There are way too many events. And the events are a complete JOKE and WASTE OF TAX DOLLARS!!!! How many events can we squeeze in that are centered around promoting getting drunk and doing drugs?! So much for a family resort! PATHETIC!
- There should be more of a presence at Base Village and the Mall. Also at the Visitors Center (already something there but not heavily used) but mostly at Base Village. A kiosk could be set up as they do at the Aspen Mall (near Paradise Bakery). This information could possibly have volunteers who would spend some time assisting the visitors. They could supply a large amount of information such as maps and fliers.
- They're killing it
- Too many events has negatively impacted all of those who live and work here. It's stretched our resources too thin. Infrastructure, both physical but also manpower. People are happy to come visit even without all the crazy events. Reduce the quantity of events and they will be even more successful without burning out the community, workers and land. Market people to come enjoy our community, nature, great restaurants — those are like minded. We do NOT need events to bring people here!!!
- TOO MANY EVENTS!!!
- Too many events, and they all seem to be getting larger/busier.
- Too much
- Too many events with low quality and low attendance not so good band in the summer. Better quality events/ bands
- Way finding still severely lacking for basic services in mall and base village. Nobody can find rentals as the signs are small and oriented poorly. Bathrooms a daily mystery for tourists, transportation to and from the mall and base village unclear, tickets offices are hidden, as are lockers (which are lacking), and it seems that the bathrooms (severely lacking) in the base village tend to get cleaned during peak usage times every day-especially in winter causing even more confusion for tourists. How did such inadequate restroom facilities even pass the building department? Water access for tourists is even more lacking. Selling bottled water seems counter to all the environmental concerns and efforts, yet it is allowed to continue...
- we are at the point where there are too many people in the summer.
- We have chosen to live at a destination resort so some advertising and marketing is necessary, but lets not over do it. lets keep offseason dead and our marketing budget reasonable.
- What happened to the snowmass discovery center? I missed education based events and locations
- When in Los Angeles I constantly see tv ads for park city . Never any for Aspen/Snowmass
- Why does every event involve drinking ?
- Work to make the website more user-friendly. Accept input from the community about the events and activities promoted. Clean up after events.

Q39. OPTIONAL: Do you have any comments about or suggestions for the services provided by the Parks, Recreation and Trails Department that you would like to share?

- 1. Our Nordic trails continue to be walked on by both humans and dogs, in areas that are well signed as skiing only. This of course, negates the hard work of the groomers, and degrades the skiing experience for the rest of us. Many of the walkers are visitors staying at the Snowmass Club who have no clue. Maybe some educational tools for the guests there?? It's a constant problem all winter and enforcement is non-existent. 2. Where did the robust weed mitigation program go that we had with Star Jamison?!? The lower South Rim at Mountain View has become as eyesore of invasive thistle, hounds tongue, etc. Bring back the program of spraying, and invasive weed mitigation!!!! This particular trail has changed so much over the past five years! 3. Signage on trails: South Rim at Mountain View needs more 'Do not cut trail signs' (or Stay on Trail) and educational brochures! Cheap fixes. It would be great to have a ranger on the trail once in awhile to see how many dogs are off leash and how many people regularly cut down the eroding washes which create the social trails. Also to pick up the poop bags that dog owners leave on the side of the trail....
- 1. The recreation facilities seem to be under-used (Soccer field, baseball diamond). 2. Sidewalks, where trails already exist, are not necessary (I.E. Brush Creek-Faraway to wood Road and Brush Creek-Owl Creek to Faraway).
- A pump track and bike skills park at the rec center parking and fields would be a huge benefit and growth opportunity for the town of Snowmass and would elevate the sense of community.
- Again, human nature comes into play. Animal Services can only be in so many places at one time so I don't blame them. I quite often see bags of dog poop on the trails, dogs off leash, dogs on trails they shouldn't be (Hawkridge), folks not yielding or announcing themselves properly. Unless humans take it upon themselves to do better it won't change.
- Allow pedal assist ebikes on single track, when the current rules were put in effect they were for gas engines, non polluting quiet Bikes did not exist.
- Are they seriously spraying Roundup on trails and paths? That's what I heard. If so, please stop.
- As our community ages E-bikes should be allowed on all trails. Also more frequent trash can attention should be paid after special events and holidays.
- Bike paths need to be repaved. Connectivity. People get lost on Brush Creek to Village Way all the time.
- Bike trails have really fallen into disrepair as of late. I think the signage is poor for bikers.
- Brush Creek trail should not be lease law. There is no wildlife 5 feet from the Brush Creek Highway.
- Closure of the bike path along Brush Creek Road from the Rodeo area to Hwy 82 just doesn't make sense.
- Connectivity is amazing. All road crossings should be clearly painted and have flashing lights. Paved surface bike paths should be maintained and repaired constantly, dealing with roots and dips and holes. It only serves to get more people on the paths when they are totally buffed.
- Definitely not a cohesive trail connection to the Rim Trail from the mall...people are too confused as to how to get there from Lot 4 & Lot ?(across from Stonebridge) to the Rim once they hit the employee housing parking lot/bike path behind Creekside condo's that are owned. They cut up between the buildings which is a safety issue to me & a bit sketchy to have strangers roaming around the buildings. We CAN do better!
- Department tries hard, but some people still leave bags of poo on trails. Some people selfish. Cigarette butts too.

- Ditch the rodeo and the rodeo grounds. SMV and its' guests would be better served by an ice rink/multi-purpose facility at that location that could be used for a multitude of purposes (including revenue generating uses) year-round.
- Ditch Trail maintenance and dog leash enforcement seriously lacking
- Dog owners need to pick up their dogs poop and putting it in a plastic bag and leaving on the trail is not picking it up. Lease laws are very poorly enforced.
- Dogs dogs. Everywhere. Off leashes. S**t everywhere!!!! What trail enforcement??? I understand that the Rec has a lot of offerings, but the prices are crazy. Please think of subsidizing or helping out locals. If we don't want everyone to be at the bars why are our recreation prices so high? The gym is outdated and small. The pool is outside when we have 8 months of winter.
- don't dumb down ort trails to suit intermediates, enough signage, no e bikes on single track
- E bike are out of control on the bike path....trails by the village bound Trails and discovery are not maintain.
- E bikes on trail system, paved paths through and around town especially, sometimes a problem. Some riders riding at high speeds, not appropriate for multi-use trails.
- Easier walking trails near Town Park would be nice. Some people just want to enjoy nature and perhaps view art set up by our town. Even a light refreshment and restroom facility in this area would be a consideration This may be in the new town plan but I am not sure it is.
- E-Bikes go way too fast on the paved trails. We need signage letting all bikers know that pedestrians have the right of way, as well as signage to encourage speeding bikers to announce they're coming and to slow down when passing pedestrians.
- Eliminate leash requirements on Ditch Trail and Rim Trail.
- Enforcement of Eike restrictions is a big thing going forward as more tourists choose to ignore signs and restrictions
- Give their budget to housing dept
- Given the exponential growth in the number of dogs and the lack of compliance, TOSV should institute dog licenses and charge licensing fees to make the program self-sustaining.
- good move putting collection cans on the Ditch Trail for poop bags
- Hard to judge enforcement when there is no trail ranger. Animal Control officers do not count as trail rangers, they have too much on their plate already. I think it would be a great idea to create a year-round trail ranger position to patrol the trails and help with enforcement.
- I have had so many interactions with dogs off leash with my bike riding. Last year I was launched off my bike multiple times by dogs not being on a leash with an owner saying, "my dog is well behaved". I always thank owners who do have their dogs on leash. Most problems on Tom Blake and Village Bound trail.
- I wish they would make some trails for people and dogs off leash only. On these trails no bikes and no equestrian would make it safe for those who wish to utilize dog and human only trails. Allowing people to walk with their dogs off leash in some places would make it easier for those of us with dogs to abide by the leash laws in other places. Why do those with horses or those on bikes get special trails but those with dogs don't?
- I would like to see more designated trail rangers
- I would like to see more in person exercise classes at the recreation center. Nobody wants to take a "virtual" class. We May need to pay professional teachers more to attract good teachers. Also early morning classes for those of us who like to work out before work.
- I would like to see Water Aerobics at the pool again.

- I've never seen a leash law enforced. Dogs off leash and their poop not being collected are definitely a problem. People also tend to end up on bike trails with their unleashed animals due to lack of markings at trail intersections.
- I'm concerned about the increased number of ebikes/etoys and safety... Also the main trail up to Base Village is getting increasingly busier especially during "rush" hour. Many different modes of transportation are being used including various activities like dog walking, scooting, biking, strollers, ebikes, one wheels - you name it - maybe clearly marked lanes or even etiquette lessons need to be reiterated/shared in a fun and friendly way. I worry about people/children getting hit that are nonchalantly walking on the "wrong" side by a blind turn...
- Increasing ebike traffic makes the bike paths a little scary in the summer. They are quiet and move at a much different pace than expected - silently gaining on you uphill for example. The cross below the snowmass center is dangerous so close the blind entrance to the center. I hope re-routing is part of the master plan for snowmass center redevelopment.
- Individual Showers/ curtains in the bathrooms. It's stressful to try and shower after a work out with strangers, even if you are trying to make it quick a little privacy could go a long way.
- Indoor winter pickleball is appreciated and hopefully not priced out of reach! Rec Center is a well run fine facility!
- It is unfortunate to see how the SM recreation center is deteriorating before our very eyes. The management is extremely lazy and entitled and it shows.
- Lack of adequate trail signs on the paved trails to aspen for our guests. Time To allow EMtn bikes on at least some of not all single track trails , we are well behind the rest of the resort communities in allowing this increasingly popular pastime ,head in the sand approach by all those capable of addressing this, always saying it's the other agency that must move forward!
- Lack of enforcement of leash laws and trail rules is significantly impacting users negatively
- Leash laws must be enforced throughout the town and trails. The addition of the pickleball courts has been great. although the on court liaison has been difficult to work with.
- Love our trails. Might recommend trail education to visitors and residents alike. If we have leash laws, they should be better enforced whenever possible
- Make sure enforcement is not prejudice towards residents, including identification on trails.
- Missing some better trail signage at some trail heads with maps (Town park bike trail information/maps), Tom Blake Trail are two examples where there seems to be some signage lacking. Lots of people parking at Rodeo grounds but where is a map near there? How about a map up by the Crossings? A map behind the grocery store (back right corner of the parking lot above the grass area/ by Romero Group spaces) also, where can people park there?
- More grooming of bike/hike/Nordic trails in winter. Open a fat bike winter trail system. Find a way to connect snowmass to Aspen by fat bike in the winter
- More off leash trails for dogs, please
- More signage on trails like distances
- Mountain biking has exploded over the past couple of years. It's a great amenity for residents and visitors alike but I have safety concerns. It is hard to find a trail just to walk/hike without being plowed over by high speed downhill bikers. Also, it is scary to see some inexperienced (often unhelmet) bikers on the road when there is an acceptable and much safer path for them to use.
- Mt bikes have ruined trails by creating dust that is unhealthy to hikers. And come flying dangerously downhill a hiker has to watch diligently to be able to jump out of the way. I don't know what the solution is. I am not against Mt bikes. At least please don't allow electric bikes. Or maybe create a Mt bike park. And have some dedicated hiking trails.
- Need more swim lessons offered and instructors.

- New treadmills in the rec center would be amazing. Also expansion of the weight room.
- Not allowing class one e mountain bikes to be allowed on single track trails is no right. Class two and three e bikes should not be allowed. They're like motorcycles/ scooters Class one is just the next generation of mountain bikes
- Overall, a very good product. Yes, we need to continue to (re) pave the asphalt trails as money and the budget allow. Progress is being made. I'd like to see animal control show up in the winter at the dedicated dog trail on Owl Creek trail and the golf course. I have been harassed and even attacked by off leash dogs a number of times. There is no accountability for careless owners. The Rec Ctr could use more space and needs to be able to meet peak demand hours better than it has historically.
- Paved paths are in horrible condition. Too many dogs off leash.
- people keep walking on trails with dogs off of leash and leaving their waste bags on the trail or in a pile somewhere. it's disgusting and not right. mountain bikers come down hiking trails. very LITTLE attention is paid to trimming hiking trails, yet mountain bike trails are immaculate. skico doesn't care about hikers, because they don't buy passes, but seriously that's wrong!
- Please improve the (currently makeshift) trail from the N Ridge LN cul-du-sac down to the Village Way paved trail. If that trail was maintained year round (groomed snow in winter and mowed in summer) I would make 50% less car trips because walking to the Village Shuttle stop would be easy.
- Rec center was built cheaply and it shows. The trail signage for cyclists (visitors) to reach Aspen from SMV is very poor. Every day in the summer I see people who are lost and can't find the connecting trail to get them to Aspen. This is most apparent at the intersection of trails going Owl Creek/Brush Creek. The connecting trail by Meadow Ranch is not signed at all so cyclists end up riding through M.R. and being unable to see the trail is supposed to go up the gravel road. It has been this way for years and I have commented on it for years! Being an almost daily user of the Nordic trails, I see some improvement on the golf course trails but we need a lot more enforcement to keep walkers and walkers with dogs off the ski-only trails.
- Removal of all of the "Star-era" signage. Too small. simply too small
- Remove leash restrictions. Run the ditch trail ditch seasonally to remove silt and slime.
- Repaving the switchbacks of the paved owl creek trail by The Pines should be a priority. Repaving the paved trail by the entrance to Two Creeks should be too. Would be great to widen all the paved trails. Is there any way to connect the Rim trail with the ditch trail? Would love for that extra connectivity!
- Rude bikers are a continuing problem.
- Signage on bikes/walking paths needs to be improved. I walk and or bike often. Almost every single day I encounter a tourist on a bike. Other than the upper part of the village, they get lost and confused EVERY day. They have no idea what to do or where to go anywhere along paths by Owl Creek by the Fire Station, Meadow Ranch, or near Cathy Robison Park. I see them get so confused and lost that they end up riding their bike on either Owl Creek or Brush Creek and abandoning the paths. If going down valley on Brush Creek to interceptor lot. They get confused about taking the path down once they cross the path by Cross Owl Creek at the Fire Station and then once across Owl Creek by the church, what are they supposed to do? And if confused, they go out onto Brush Creek and ride on the road. The same is true when they come from Aspen via Owl Creek.....once they get to crossing paths at Cathy Robinson Park, total confusion/frustration and they go out onto the road to bike up, It need A LOT of attention

- Since walkers cannot access the Nordic system along Owl Creek, it would be appreciated if the Owl Creek bike/pedestrian Trail was groomed throughout the winter to give walkers a place to exercise along Owl Creek.
- snowmass xc ski trails are dominated by dogs off leash and dog walkers - making the experience very ugly for the person trying to enjoy the trails xc skiing
- Stop closing so many trails and long time periods.. The big killers of baby elk , deer, etc. are bears, lions, and wolf packs.
- Thank you for doing all the work on the playground! Y'all need to take some responsibility for the wonderful physical health many of us enjoy!
- The amount of unleashed dogs on the bike path and trails is getting out of hand! Dogs should be leashed since SMV has a leash law and it should be enforced. The constant calling out "he's friendly" as their dog rushes you on the bike path is harassment by an unwanted animal and quite dangerous in the snow and ice. Not to mentioned those of us that have our dogs on leash do not need an unleashed dog rushing up on our dog or person. The number of ebikes and the speed that they ride on the bike path is also becoming dangerous. People are rarely using bike path/trail etiquette and families/groups of people on ebikes frequently take up the entire bike path riding side by side (instead of single file) and runners/walkers etc. must yield to them. At times, having to completely hop off the bike path just to avoid getting hit by the careless rider(s). The bike path(s) around SMV used to be such a great place to run/walk/walk with our dog but quickly becoming more and more dangerous. I have experienced similar issues on the Nordic trails around the SMV golf course each winter. People are walking/stomping/letting dogs walk all over the ski only paths! Again, dogs are unleashed and I have been harassed/nipped at while on ski's by someone's dog. There needs to be some type of enforcement on our bike paths, summer trails and nordic trails. Signage is fine but without consequences it does absolutely nothing for those breaking the rules.
- The bike trail at Tom Blake is too steep. Dangerous for everyone
- The extended closure of trails in Two Creeks until June 28th makes no sense if Tom Blake opens on June 21st and the area is accessible. It needs to be consistent.
- The lack of trail etiquette is astonishing. But worst is when eBikes are approaching walkers and do not alert. Due to their speed and how quickly they approach, it is startling. Very disappointing. Wish people would have a better sense of common courtesy.
- The Nordic trails last year were negatively impacted by all the walkers and dogs who broke the rules. The trails here are challenging and when the groomed trails have lots of foot prints in them, it makes very hard to ski. I went to the Aspen Golf course most days. It would have been nice to have better trails here. I think most people just do not understand the impact they have. It would also be nice to have the Nordic shop back.
- The Owl Creek Chase could use MAJOR SIGNAGE! How about a place for SUP, Snowmass Village would have everything if it had water usage. What about the Ziegler Reservoir, SMV bought it for our water shed, but what about non motorized vessels from Dawn to Dusk, No Alcohol, fishing, a small fee or seasonal permits?? I will work there! Please!!!!!!!!!!!!!! Too far to Ruedi and too far and no parking for the Aspen Nature Preserve.
- the published trail maps have serious errors, and there should be signs at all trail intersections. It would be nice for there to be more hiking trails leading down from the top of the gondola, especially directly to the mall.
- The Rec Center needs to explore expansion, becoming over crowded regularly.
- The Recreation Center is a phenomenal facility, but I feel that the number of members is outgrowing the space. Many times it feels cramped and busy during evening hours.

- the situation with dogs off leash and people not cleaning up after their dogs is very poorly managed. Putting the dog poop in a bag and left on the trail is not picking up after them. We need a dog park where the dogs can run free and play with one another, socialize. Many towns have terrain parks for dogs to enjoy. Dogs need options. Also the town needs far more parks that have trees and areas to just sit and enjoy being here. If you look at Aspen you will see many parks that are just meant to relax and enjoy. It appears that most of our parks are for sports and that is good but we desperately needs parks in lovely setting to just have a picnic and enjoy the area.
- The Snowmass Recreation Center is drastically overcrowded. It was waaaaay 'underbuilt'. Maybe the influx of new residents is the reason it is so overcrowded. Too bad because it used to be a nice facility, The Snowmass Club is far to expensive so no other options in SMV, at least for me.
- The town should consider paying higher wages to fitness staff in order to retain instructors and be able to build and maintain a strong and consistent group fitness program.
- there are plenty of dog walkers who let their dogs walk on the trails off-leash, despite rules saying dogs should be kept on-leash
- There are several paved trails that are in rough shape and need to be fixed, patched, re-paved, etc. There also seems to be some single track trails that are maintained fine, but others that could use some work.
- There are too many walkers on the nordic trails in winter. They have become almost unskiable. There needs to be more uphill only bike/hike trails like the Discovery Trail. There are too many dogs off leashes on the trails year round.
- Tina and Lauren do an amazing job but they need HELP! There need to be several full-time rangers to strictly enforce the trail rules and ordinances.
- Too many biker/hiker conflicts.
- Too many dogs off leash especially during spring when newborns with mothers are frequently encountered. Also dogs off leash put stress on wildlife in winter. Fines should be issued automatically.
- Too much interaction with bikers on hiking trails
- Top of Anaerobic Nightmare isn't labeled very well.
- Unfortunately with the explosion of Ebikes, many people completely disregard the NO EBIKES signs on many of the train and blatantly go on these trails. Many of these people are inexperienced riders that not only put themselves in danger but everyone else on the trail as well. In addition some (NOT ALL) are quite rude when reminded about NO Ebikes on trails. Something really needs to be done about this before someone really gets hurt. There is a reason why trails like Deadline require skills to guide and aerobic ability to get there.
- Unleashed dogs are dangerous on shared use trails.
- Until recently, some paved trails have suffered from deferred maintenance and were in a shameful state of disrepair.
- Visitors need better instructions on trail etiquette and it's a shame that Ditch Trail now has trashcans lining it because people can't clean up after their pets. Also the signage for Vista trail needs to be improved immensely; even as a local, I don't think I've ever taken the same route twice. It's confusing up there and with its proximity to the Base Village there needs to be better signage.
- We could improve with shortcutting and trail braiding
- We need an enclosed dog park
- We need more dedicated hiking trails, especially on the Alpine Springs and Sam's Knob areas.
- we need more trails for dogs and people free from the danger of mountain bikes

- We need more work on the thistles growing in the open spaces. They need to be removed or hit with an herbicide before they seed in the late summer, otherwise the problem just continues. Getting to them before they seed will produce a smaller crop each year and make them easier to deal with in the future.
- why didn't you ask the question about E BIKE enforcement? its ridiculous. they are all over our single track trails. they ignore the little signs, are rude, can't ride and this is untenable. this is a major safety issue
- Why does Snowmass not have Silver Sneakers for Seniors?
- Why in the world don't we have a dog park in Snowmass Village???
- Worst trail map EVER. Hire tourism staff and pay to have a good area trail map made.
- Would like to see more yoga classes and earlier / later for people who have daily commitments such as work/children. Also, the hours of the rec center are not enough. - Again, it is very trendy to blame all housing problems on STR's while at the same time promoting their usage and enjoying the income produced. You can't have it both ways. We are a resort first and a community second. None of this would even exist without the ski area. None. We build community, you maintain it. Not the other way around.
- All I hear about is housing.
- All they seem to do is pay attention to Skico and promote marketing. There is little concern for maintaining the character of our village and the impacts of over-tourism.
- Cant relate to the Council and its curtain pro development attitude
- Council and Senior Staff seem to have minds made up in advance and have not welcomed or responded to significant proposals, despite considerable back-up material I have provided.
- Doesn't seem like the town cares too much about locals... the town seems to care more about money than responsible growth.
- Don't think the latino community at Snowmass is represented or heard well enough.
- focused on development. waste of money on master plan that turned us into vail
- For three years I've been working on trying to get the town to even talk about e bikes. Numerous e mails to council members and not ONE reply. Very rude and unprofessional
- GID Metro District.
- Give more time for public feedback not during work hours. Most people policies actually effect have to work during the day and cannot go to a meeting before 5pm. The meeting I have attended are frequented by opinionated/uninformed part time residents who would rather see the town become a retirement community in the mountains without realizing the effects it will have on the amenities they currently enjoy. Give normal working class people more opportunity and education on matters being decided.

- Have council member answer email addressed to them
- Have emailed the town council members with no response!
- I (along with many others) keep sharing that there are too many events. It is wearing down our community in numerous ways. This is being ignored! Improvement would look like reducing the number of events!
- I feel like the Town manager will do whatever he wants regardless of residents' opinions. The rodeo is a benefit to this community, but I feel he is determined to end it. There are other places people could park.
- I find it very difficult to know what the Council is working on a weekly basis. A column in the paper (Daily News) with current issues and what the Town is facing would be helpful. A report on the weekly meetings would help all residents feel up to date without having to research it on the Town site. Then, provide contact info of Council members so citizens can comment and directly connect with our representatives.
