- Don't forget the Have a Drink with the Council event at 4:00 on Monday at the Ranger Station. Yep, you guessed it, all the cool kids will be there.
- We are continuing to take steps to put a question on the November 2023 ballot asking for voter approval to remove the Charter prohibition of Council members serving on Boards and Commissions.
- Good news, our fiber contractor (JKL) has finished boring under Hwy 82 to get the necessary fiber conduit to the Brush Creek Intercept Lot. Now that the conduit is in the ground, the contractor will be able to begin pulling the actual fiber through the conduit. Once the fiber is in place, we will be able to start connecting buildings. Baby steps, but in the right direction.
- Dig we must for a better community..... lots of digging and planning is going on. The Chapel culvert project remains on schedule. The Kearns Road culvert is still in design but we are starting to order long lead-time materials so work can begin in a month, we are looking for a contractor to replace the concrete at Town Park Station, and we almost have the architect for Little Red under contract. In addition to projects the Town is leading, Building 12 is going vertical with a "green", leading edge material and Building 13 received its roof. It looks as though both of these buildings will be enclosed by the winter so work can continue. The Haven's, (aka Fanny Hill Townhomes) are now largely completed and have received their certificates of occupancy.
- Don't forget to pay attention to the summer Dealio's. Our events are always fun, but they are twice as fun when they are half the price.
- The Part time Residents Advisory Board is planning their summer event for August 10.
- Yep, it's a home run. The Tripple Crown (kind of like Little League, but cooler) is in town this weekend.
- We are continuing to work with We-cycle to have an e-bike program implemented in 2025. Lots of details still to be developed, but it is looking like we will have about 14 total stations with about 90 e-bikes circulating through town.
- In the mean time, our e-bike stations continue to be the most highly used in their entire valley-wide system.
- Yes, it is the middle of July and in the 80's but we are already starting to hire bus drivers for the upcoming ski season.

- Glacial success abounds. Viewfinders are being installed near spiral point, Discovery posters are on the buses, and one mural is in progress.
