### TOWN OF SNOWMASS VILLAGE HOUSEHOLD COMPOSTING



The year-round household compost drop-off is conveniently located at the Public Works facility, and comes at no extra cost to our valued customers.

It's important to note that only specific materials are accepted in the compost container. Please refrain from disposing of Styrofoam waxed or plastic-covered containers, glass, silverware, cans, bottles or plastic bags in the compost. For proper waste management, ensure that garbage and recycling items are kept separate from the materials designated for food composting. Your cooperation helps us maintain an efficient and environmentally friendly composting system.

### Monitored Alarm Permits

If your residence has a monitored alarm, you are required to register the alarm information through the Snowmass Police Department. This is an online process done through a company called MuniRevs. Many residents already have an account set up with MuniRevs. If you do, let Meg know and she will add the alarm permit to your existing account. The process is similar to setting up a business license. Under "activity type", select Alarm Permit.

The annual fee for an alarm permit is \$50.

The Town of Snowmass Village values and encourages citizen participation in local government processes. One way to get involved is through service on a volunteer board. Snowmass Village has 9 boards and commissions.

Some of the Town's boards require special qualifications such as residency, or technical expertise. There may be other qualifications required for membership on some boards but for the most part, the volunteer boards have a cross-section of community members willing to give of their time and particular talents.

Boards & Commissions meet at regular frequencies, as determined by each board. Each board is responsible for specific areas of expertise and provide valuable advice and feedback to the Town Council. Meeting agendas, packets, and minutes are posted regularly on the town's website.

## **Citizens Grant Review Board**

- Views the process for which nonprofit organizations can apply for grant funding.

## **Environmental Advisory Board (EAB)**

- This board is committed to updating and accomplishing the goals of the town's Environmental Sustainability Plan.

## **Financial Advisory Board (FAB)**

- This board makes recommendations prior to the adoption of the budget and capital program for the town and renders additional recommendations or advice at the council's request.

## **Local Marijuana Licensing Authority**

- This board is responsible for reviewing, processing, and approving or denying applications for the establishment of retail marijuana stores in Snowmass Village.

## **Marketing, Group Sales & Events Board**

- This board advises on the development of tourism for the benefit of the Snowmass Village economy.

## **Parks, Open Space, Trails, & Recreation Advisory Board (POSTR)**

- Provides oversight and input on the Town's parks, open space, trails, and recreation programs.

## **Part-Time Resident Advisory Board (PTRAB)**

- This board represents those who have real property interests within the Town of Snowmass Village, but do not reside here full time.

## **Planning Commission**

- The commission advises Town Council on all matters related to the growth and development of land in Snowmass Village.

## **Snowmass Arts Advisory Board (SAAB)**

- This board is responsible for providing direction on cultural arts initiatives.

# TOWN CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

## Vidal Gulch Repair Project:

- The project is complete, and the Nature Trail is re-open with a new bridge.

## Lower Kearns Road Culvert Replacement Project:

- The project continues to progress with backfill operations. Head/wing wall construction will begin next week. The traffic shift to move into Phase 2 is scheduled for early March. Expect this project to continue until June.

## Town Park Project:

Town Park Phase I is being constructed on schedule. Pictured are the new maintenance facility's exterior and interior. On the exterior picture, you can see large concrete cylinders next to the facility where the new grandstands will be installed over this facility! Today, 2/1, staff met with the construction manager to identify where electrical components will be installed inside the building. This remains a closed site for safety, but you can see all this exciting progress from the Town Park parking lot and as you drive by on Brush Creek Rd.



## Proposed Roundabout at Brush Creek Road & Owl Creek Road:


- To improve the safety and function of the intersection of Brush Creek Road & Owl Creek Road, a roundabout has been proposed. This roundabout would replace the existing intersection and incorporate the multimodal connection created by the new culvert structure. The planning process for this roundabout has not yet started. 
Route #2 service is not available until 1:35 p.m. and will continue with 20-minute shuttle service intervals until 9:35 p.m. Route #2 service is available by request from 9:35 p.m.-12:45 a.m. by calling 970-923-3500.

Route #3 service is available with 20-minute shuttle service intervals from 6:40 a.m.-5:20 p.m. At 5:20 p.m., Route #3 service will be available at 30-minute shuttle service intervals until 11:20 p.m., and then available by request until 12:45 a.m. by calling 970-923-3500.
