



TRAILS ORDINANCES

Sec. 8-29. - Camping prohibited.

1st \$50 2nd SUMMONS

No person shall camp in or upon any Town-regulated parking lot or upon any Town-owned property. The Town Council may, from time to time, designate an area or areas where camping may be allowed and may promulgate such reasonable rules and regulations governing camping as it deems appropriate. For the purpose of this regulation, a person shall be deemed to be camping if such person occupies any Town-regulated parking lot, or other Town-owned property, in a motor vehicle, tent or other shelter with the intent of utilizing such shelter as an abode or as a place to sleep. Camping on private property within the Town limits is regulated by [Chapter 16A](#) of this Code.

Sec. 10-21. - Unlawful conduct on public property. (Example: Biking prohibited/horses prohibited/ebikes, eboards)

1st \$100 2nd SUMMONS

It is unlawful for any person to enter or remain in any public building or on any public property or to conduct himself or herself in or on them in violation of any order, rule or regulation concerning any matter prescribed in this Section, limiting or prohibiting the use, activities or conduct in such public building or on such public property, issued by any officer or agency having the power of control, management or supervision of the building or property. In addition to any authority granted by any other law, each such officer or agency may adopt such orders, rules or regulations as are reasonably necessary for the administration, protection and maintenance of such public buildings and property, specifically, orders, rules and regulations upon the following matters:

1. Preservation of property, vegetation, wildlife, signs, markers, statues, buildings, grounds and other structures, and any object of scientific, historical or scenic interest;
2. Restriction or limitation of the use of such public buildings or property as to time, manner or permitted activities;
3. Prohibition of activities or conduct within public buildings or on public property which may be reasonably expected to substantially interfere with the use and enjoyment of such places by others or which may constitute a general nuisance;
4. Hunting, camping and picnicking, public meetings and assemblages and other individual or group usages, including the place, time and manner in which such activities may be permitted;
 - a) Use of all vehicles as to place, time and manner of use; and
 - b) Control and limitations of fires and designation of places where fires are permitted.
 - c) No conviction may be obtained under this Section unless notice of such limitations or prohibitions is prominently posted at all public entrances to such building or property or unless such notice is actually first given the person by the officer or agency, including any agent thereof, or by any law enforcement officer having jurisdiction or authority to enforce this Section.
 - d) Any person who violates this Section is guilty of unlawful conduct on public property.

Sec. 10-25. - Injuring or destroying public property.

SUMMONS

It shall be unlawful for any person to either willfully, maliciously, wantonly, negligently or in any other manner injure or destroy real property, improvements thereto or moveable or personal property belonging to the Town.

Sec. 10-29. - Seasonal trail closures.

1st OFFENSE \$100, 2nd SUMMONS

It shall be unlawful for any person to use by any means the following trails or areas during wildlife sensitive periods as follows

Tom Blake & Sequel & Vista to Gov Trail (Area A)	April 25th through & including June 20th
Anaerobic Nightmare (Area B)	April 25th through & including June 27th
Government East of Elk Camp Work Road (Area C)	May 15th through & including June 27th
Vista from Government to Elk Camp (Area C)	May 15th through & including June 27th
North Rim (northeast of Sinclair Road)	December 1st through & including May 15th
Seven Star	December 1st through & including May 15th
Ditchline	December 1st through & including May 15th
Viewline	December 1st through & including May 15th
Deadline	December 1st through & including May 15th

Sec. 10-31. - Use of Electrical Assisted Bicycles.

1ST Offense \$50 2nd SUMMONS

- (a) It is unlawful for any person to operate any Class 1 of Electrical Assisted Bicycles, as such Electrical Assisted Bicycles are defined in Colorado Revised Statutes Section 42-1-102 (28.5)(a), on any unpaved bike or pedestrian path or trail in the Town of Snowmass Village.
- (b) It is unlawful for any person to operate any Class 2 or Class 3 of Electrical Assisted Bicycles, as such Electrical Assisted Bicycles are defined in Colorado Revised Statutes Section 42-1-

102 (28.5)(b) and (c), on any bike or pedestrian path or trail in the Town of Snowmass Village.

- (c) It shall only be lawful for any person to operate any Class 1 of Electrical Assisted Bicycles, as such Electrical Assisted Bicycles are defined in Colorado Revised Statutes Section 42-1-102 (28.5)(a), on a paved bike or pedestrian path or trail in the Town of Snowmass Village.
- (d) *Paved bike or pedestrian path or trail* shall mean a path or trail that has a hard surface of asphalt or concrete.
- (e) *Unpaved bike or pedestrian path or trail* shall mean a path or trail that has a surface of anything but asphalt or concrete.

Sec. 10-32. - No motorized vehicles on sidewalk or path.

1ST \$50 2ND \$100 3RD SUMMONS

No person shall operate any type of motor or motorized vehicle, on any sidewalk, paved or unpaved bike or pedestrian path or trail or other pedestrian way, except town and county maintenance and emergency services vehicles are permitted.
