Seasonal Road Weight Restrictions Start March 15

Heavy Loads Restricted March 15- June 15

Seasonal weight limits go into effect beginning March 15th each year to protect our secondary subdivision roadways when roadway sub bases are wet and soft. The maximum gross vehicle weight limit for these roadways are 40,000 pounds. This restriction is in place through June 15th.



TOWN CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

Lower Kearns Road Culvert Replacement Project:

- The project continues to progress with backfill operations. The traffic shift to move into Phase 2 is scheduled for March 7th or 8th, which will result in alternating one lane traffic on Brush Creek for the day. This lane shift will allow the project to replace the other half of the culvert. See Phase 2 layout below:



Little Red School House Expansion Project:

- The design development continues with a land use package as the next milestone. The project team has recently met with the Town Council, Planning Commission, and POSTR Board to gather further feedback and further refine the design.
- Design revisions will occur and be presented to the Town Council prior to being submitted for the land use process.


Town Park Project:

- The first phase of the Town Park Completion Plan is continuing to make strides towards completion. Now mostly enclosed and insulated, the maintenance facility has passed the halfway mark and construction crews are beginning to install electricity. Additionally, steel began arriving for the new grandstands! As March and April approach, you can expect to see the grandstands rise over the maintenance facility and the new rodeo arena set into place.



Proposed Roundabout at Brush Creek Road & Owl Creek Road:

- To improve the safety and function of the intersection of Brush Creek Road & Owl Creek Road, a roundabout has been proposed. This roundabout would replace the existing intersection and incorporate the multimodal connection created by the new culvert structure. The planning process for this roundabout has not yet started. More information will be shared as it becomes available.


ICE AGE DISCOVERY WEEKLY WALKS

These incentives offered by the co-op help members offset initial costs for energy-efficient upgrades, ultimately cutting overall energy consumption, reducing individual energy bills, and promoting the adoption of electric alternatives over fossil fuels like natural gas or propane. SOLID WASTE & RECYCLING NEWS

- Bears are waking up and have been sighted roaming around Aspen. Do NOT leave trash containers out overnight, and ensure dumpster sights are correctly closed and secured to mitigate wildlife access.
- Composting bin collection site is available for household food waste at the Public Works facility site, 3745 Owl Creek Road. FREE composting bags can be picked up at Town Hall and Public Works.
- All Residents receive an annual \$100 credit at Pitkin County Landfill. This can be used for electronics, yard waste, hazardous materials and more. Learn more about the credit at [Pitkin County Landfill](#)

RESIDENTIAL COMPOSTING

The Town of Snowmass Village offers all residents residential composting free of charge. Containers for the home are available at Public Works and Town Hall and the public drop-off container is located at the Public Works facility at 3745 Owl Creek Road.

Small amounts of food-soiled paper and compostable packaging are acceptable, including pizza and paperboard take-out containers, Please tear pizza boxes and paperboard containers into pieces before composting.

Please, no Styrofoam, waxed, or plastic-covered containers, glass, silverware, cans, bottles, or plastic bags. Garbage and recycling must be kept separate from food composting materials.



VILLAGE SHUTTLE IN WINTER SCHEDULE

The Village Shuttle is now on its winter season service schedule. The Village Shuttle will be operating on a reduced schedule this winter. Affected routes will be Route #2 and Route #3.

Route #2 service is not available until 1:35 p.m. and will continue with 20-minute shuttle service intervals until 9:35 p.m. Route #2 service is available by request from 9:35 p.m.-12:45 a.m. by calling 970-923-3500.

Route #3 service is available with 20-minute shuttle service intervals from 6:40 a.m.-5:20 p.m. At 5:20 p.m., Route #3 service will be available at 30-minute shuttle service intervals until 11:20 p.m., and then available by request until 12:45 a.m. by calling 970-923-3500.


PARKING IN SNOWMASS VILLAGE

The Town of Snowmass Village manages free and paid parking lots. Regulations and enforcement change according to seasons and snow removal needs, so please abide by signage posted on lots for up-to-date information.

- During the winter ski season (Thanksgiving - April), the numbered Village Lots are paid permit parking only. Residents, seniors, employees, and lodging guests may obtain parking permits for the numbered Village Lots by visiting our Parking Permits Webpage.
- Free short-term parking for shopping at the Mall is always available in Lot 6 and the upper portion of Lot 5.
- In the summer, parking in all of the Village Lots and the Base Village Parking Garage is FREE. Please note that there is NO CAMPING in Town of Snowmass Village parking lots.
