The Town of Snowmass Village values and encourages citizen participation in local government processes. One way to get involved is through service on a volunteer board. Snowmass Village has 9 boards and commissions.

Boards & Commissions meet at regular frequencies, as determined by each board. Each board is responsible for specific areas of expertise and provide valuable advice and feedback to the Town Council. Meeting agendas, packets, and minutes are posted regularly on the town's website.

### April Boards & Commissions Agenda items:

#### Environmental Advisory Board (EAB)

# TOWN CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

## Lower Kearns Road Culvert Replacement Project:

- The project has progressed into Phase 2 of the culvert replacement. Phase 2 includes the replacement of the southern half of the existing culvert to mirror what was completed in Phase 1. The traffic shift has been completed and drilling/digging for the excavation stabilization will be occurring over the next couple weeks.

## Connecting Village Nodes:


- The Town has signed a design consultant contract with DJ&A for a project known as Connecting Village Nodes. The overall project goal is to create more functional and intuitive multimodal connections between the Snowmass Center, Base Village, and the Snowmass Mall to increase economic vitality and better the visitor and local experience. The current contract is focused developing alternatives for the connection between the Snowmass Center and Base Village including the possible use of the easement between Snowmass One and the Capital Peak Lodge. The project will develop improvement alternatives for Council's review.

## Projects Out for Bid:

- Numerous CIP projects are advertised for construction bids at the moment. The Fiber Phase 2, Brush Creek Multimodal, and Hard Surface Trail projects are currently advertised. These projects are planned to be completed throughout the 2024 construction season. The Highline Multimodal and Road Division projects will also be advertised for bid in the coming weeks.

## Proposed Roundabout at Brush Creek Road & Owl Creek Road:

- To improve the safety and function of the intersection of Brush Creek Road & Owl Creek Road, a roundabout has been proposed. This roundabout would replace the existing intersection and incorporate the multimodal connection created by the new culvert structure. The planning process for this roundabout has not yet started. More information will be shared as it becomes available.



# TOWN CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

## Highline Road Gas Line Construction Project:

In spring 2024, the Town of Snowmass Village and utility providers will undertake a construction project along Highline Road and Owl Creek Road. The project aims to overlay pavement, introduce a multimodal component to Highline Road, and replace a gas line with Black Hill Energy. The construction will be carried out in three phases to minimize traffic disruption.

The tentative timeline includes:

- **April 1 - April 22:** Road closure from the roundabout to Snowmass Club Circle with a detour route.
- **April 23 - May 10:** Road closure from Snowmass Club Circle to the intersection of Highline & Owl Creek Road with a detour route.
- **Mid-May – Late-June:** Single-lane closure from the intersection of Highline & Owl Creek Road to Tom Blake TH.
- **Paving on Highline Road** is scheduled for mid-May.
- **Paving on Owl Creek Road**, including a tie-in to the existing pavement, is planned for late-June.

These closures and lane restrictions will affect traffic, but the project is organized to mitigate overall disruption.



# TOWN CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

## Town Park Project:

- Construction crews moved into the spring phase of construction in late March
- Crews will complete infrastructure work in the construction area outlined in red in April, laying the foundation for what will become the rodeo arena. This phase includes the arena, stocks, announcers' booth, and other components of the rodeo.
- This project is projected to be completed in early June. The first rodeo of the season is scheduled for June 19. This the Snowmass Rodeo's 50th year!

# SEASONAL ROAD WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS ARE IN PLACE UNTIL JUNE 15TH

Seasonal weight limits go into effect beginning March 15th each year to protect our secondary subdivision roadways when roadway subbases are wet and soft. The maximum gross vehicle weight limit for these roadways is 40,000 pounds. This restriction is in place until 12:00 PM on June 15th

## RESIDENTIAL COMPOSTING

The Town of Snowmass Village offers all residents residential composting free of charge. Containers for the home are available at Public Works and Town Hall and the public drop-off container is located at the Public Works facility at 3745 Owl Creek Road.

Small amounts of food-soiled paper and compostable packaging are acceptable, including pizza and paperboard take-out containers, Please tear pizza boxes and paperboard containers into pieces before composting.

Please, no Styrofoam, waxed, or plastic-covered containers, glass, silverware, cans, bottles, or plastic bags. Garbage and recycling must be kept separate from food composting materials.

The Village Shuttle switches to the spring season service schedule on April 15th.


When construction begins on Highline Road from the Snowmass Club to Owl Creek, service to Owl Creek Road will be by request only. Call 970.923.35 for a ride.
