PART-TIME RESIDENTS ADVISORY BOARD (PTRAB)

The Part-time Residents Advisory Board (PTRAB) provides a mechanism of improved communication between part-time residents in the Town of Snowmass Village (TOSV) and the Town Council. Part-time residents are owners, or the designated representative of an owner of real property, of various property types in the Town of Snowmass Village and who are not eligible to be registered voters in the Town. The PTRAB meets the 4th Tuesday of each month at 15:30 local time. The meetings are moderated by a Board member and graciously facilitated with assistance from the Assistant Town Manager and Town Clerk. The public is encouraged to participate by addressing the Board with concerns and comments.

The Town of Snowmass Village Part-Time Residents Advisory Board members are volunteers appointed to a 3-year term by the Town Council and carry out such duties as directed by the Town Council which provides a mechanism of communication and education between second homeowners and the Town Council. The Board provides input on issues to assist the Town Council in the establishment of town policy and advises on matters in which the Town Council believes that part-time residents can provide broad-based experience and knowledge of local issues.

VILLAGE SHUTTLE SUMMER SCHEDULE


The Village Shuttle summer season service schedules began on Monday, June 3. In June, the Village Shuttle app was launched and made available for download.



DRAW SITE WORKFORCE HOUSING PROJECT

PTRAB remains informed on how the TOSV is addressing issues related to ongoing workforce housing shortages. A new employee housing development is currently being planned for a plot of open land up the hill from the Town Hall, known as the Draw Site.



Following the adoption of the [2021 Workforce Housing Master Plan](#), staff has been developing new employee housing opportunities on the parcel of land behind the Town Hall known as the Draw Site. This site was identified for employee housing when it was deeded to the Town nearly 40 years ago. The site is close to the Snowmass Center, transit stops, and existing infrastructure.

The design team, headed by Site Architects from Carbondale, has taken a “site-first” approach to providing housing at this location and has begun the design process. The site is steep and surrounded by hillsides, so designers have minimized the need for retaining walls and hill cuts by creating a design that sits into the mountainside and rises with the elevation. They are planning for a fully underground parking garage structure with two residential above. A sizable courtyard would be between the two towers to provide access for emergency vehicles and offer a flexible, green outdoor amenity for all tenants. Early floorplans would offer a view of the mountain from virtually every apartment and would include substantial common space, including a rooftop deck. The building would offer 79 one-, two- and three-bedroom apartments for people working in Snowmass Village.

Design and engineering planning will proceed throughout the spring, summer and fall of 2024. Due to the size of the development, there will likely be a ballot question for voters in November to approve or deny it, as well as opportunities for residents to express their thoughts by commenting at a Town Council meeting.

The Town Council has directed staff to purchase the land behind the Snowmass Center for future housing development. That site received approval several years ago to develop 65 free-market housing units. However, the developer did not move forward with that plan, and the Town is presently in negotiations with the owner to purchase just the residential, undeveloped portion. Together with the Draw Site, this land provides an opportunity to build a mountainside neighborhood that provides a range of housing options that serve entry-level employees, mid-level managers, families, and seniors. SEVERAL TOWN CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS COMPLETED THIS SUMMER


PTRAB remains informed on how Town is addressing issues related to public infrastructure. The following projects are slated for completion this summer:

- [Town Park & Snowmass Rodeo Project](#) - Construction at the rodeo grounds reached near-full completion by the first rodeo of the season.
- [Highline Road Gas Line Project](#) - The gas line project on Highline Road is expected to be completed by the end of June. Paving operations will occur before the road's reopening. Please respect all detours and traffic control measures while crews complete this project.
- [Lower Kearns Road Culvert Reconstruction Project](#) - The culvert replacement project is anticipated to be fully completed by early July. The culvert structure is in place and crews will finalize the site before the road returns to its original alignment.



PROPOSED ROUNDABOUT AT BRUSH CREEK ROAD & OWL CREEK ROAD

- The Town of Snowmass Village, with the design consultant team from SGM, have continued with the civil engineering design for a proposed single-lane roundabout at the intersection of Owl Creek Road and Brush Creek Road.
- The proposed roundabout replaces the existing T-intersection and includes pavement reconstruction, additional bus stops, sidewalks, retaining walls, storm drainage, utility relocations, water line installation, and trail improvements.
- The Town is working with utility providers to have the necessary aging utility infrastructure upgraded simultaneously as part of this infrastructure project. This project improves safety and aging infrastructure while also addressing the existing intersection's failing level of service for turning moves at peak hour traffic.
- The design team is working on landscaping rendering and will present it to the Town Council later this summer, along with budget estimates.

NEW SNOWMASS ICE AGE DISCOVERY TALK & TOURS

In 2010, a construction crew unearthed a single tusk of a mammoth while digging at Ziegler Reservoir in Snowmass Village. The Denver Museum of Nature and Science took over the site and went on to unearth 35,000 bones of large mammals and small vertebrate species. The Snowmass paleontological site is the richest Ice Age ecosystem ever found at high altitude. New for the 2024 summer season, Snowmass Tourism and the Aspen Science center have partnered to create a weekly tour, the Ice Age Discovery Talk & Tour, starting June 14, which takes guests on a guided journey around Snowmass every Friday throughout the summer.

The tour highlights the unique Ice Age story and showcases three new unique murals on the Snowmass Mall and in Snowmass Base Village, created by regional, national, and international artists. Under construction this summer for the 2024/2025 winter ski season, a new chairlift makes its debut on Snowmass Ski Area. With a start across from the Snowmass Mall, the new chairlift replaces the Cony Glade lift for easier and faster access to Snowmass' 3,300+ acres of terrain.
