DON'T SPARK A WILDFIRE

PLEASE BE SAFE... The wildfire danger in Snowmass Village remains “HIGH” throughout the 4th of July weekend.

Although there are currently no Pitkin County fire restrictions in place, the Roaring Fork Fire Rescue reminds everyone that conditions in Snowmass Village are extremely dry. Be extra cautious with any outdoor BBQ plans, and only use designated fire pits when camping.



Never leave an open flame unattended and extinguish all fires completely. Please have a safe holiday, and remember... any fireworks that leave the ground are illegal in Colorado.

Be Prepared- Your wildfire emergency plan must be prepared well in advance of a fire and shared with all members of your household. EV SAFE CHARGING AT HOME

SAFETY TIPS

- Use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Read and follow all manufacturer directions.
- Check chargers and cords for damage before using. Never use if damaged.
- Do not use extension cords with the charger.
- Install charging equipment in safe locations. Keep away from busy areas and things that could catch fire.
- Keep charging items out of reach of children and animals when not in use.
- Cover charging station outlet to keep water out.
- Before charging an electric vehicle at home, have a qualified electrician:
 - Check your electrical system to see if it can handle charging.
 - Install a new circuit just for your charging device.

Warning!

- ⚡ Electric vehicles have high voltage batteries.
- ⚡ Battery maintenance should be performed by the manufacturer.
- ⚡ Do not touch the orange high voltage cables.



For Level 1 Charging:

- Use the charging cord that came with the electric vehicle.
- Use a standard household plug.
- Make sure charger or outlet has GFCI protection.
- Use only a dedicated circuit to charge.

For Level 2 Charging:

- Use a 240-volt outlet. A qualified electrician needs to install this type of outlet.
- Only use outdoor rated charging stations outdoors.
- Keep cords off the ground.

TOWN CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

Fiber Broadband Phase 2:


- The Fiber Phase 2 project received two bids. The project team will award the contract to the selected contractor within the week. Construction will be completed throughout summer/fall 2024 throughout the Village.

Little Red School House:

- The project team continues to refine the revised design for expanding early childcare education opportunities at the Little Red Schoolhouse. The design will be presented to the Town Council in August to get approval to submit a development application.

Proposed Roundabout at Brush Creek Road & Owl Creek Road:

- The Town of Snowmass, with the design consultant team from SGM, have continued with the civil engineering design for a proposed single-lane roundabout at the intersection of Owl Creek Road and Brush Creek Road.
- The proposed roundabout replaces the existing T-intersection and includes pavement reconstruction, additional bus stops, sidewalks, retaining walls, storm drainage, utility relocations, water line installation, and trail improvements.
- The Town is working with utility providers to have the necessary aging utility infrastructure upgraded simultaneously as part of this infrastructure project.
- This project improves safety and aging infrastructure while also addressing the existing intersection's *failing level of service* for turning moves at peak hour traffic.
- The design team is working on landscaping rendering and will present it to the Town Council later this summer, along with budget estimates.

TOWN CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

Draw Site Workforce Housing Project:

Over the past year, the Town has been working on developing new employee housing opportunities on the parcel of land behind the Town Hall known as the Draw Site. This site was identified for employee housing when it was deeded to the Town nearly 40 years ago and was the top priority of the Town Council after completion of the Housing Master Plan. The site is in close proximity to the Snowmass Center, transit stops, and existing infrastructure.

The design team, headed by Site Architects from Carbondale, has taken a “site-first” approach to providing housing at this location and has begun the design process. The site is steep and surrounded by hillsides, so designers are working to minimize the need for retaining walls and hill cuts by creating a design that sits into the mountainside and rises with the elevation. As currently envisioned, the development will offer 79 one-, two- and three-bedroom apartments for people working full-time in Snowmass Village. The site will include a fully underground parking garage structure with two residential structures above. A sizable courtyard will be located between the two towers to provide access for emergency vehicles and offer a flexible, green outdoor amenity for all tenants. Early floorplans offer a view of the mountain from virtually every apartment and include substantial common space, including a rooftop deck.

Design and engineering are still in the development stage. Because Snowmass Village voters approved using a portion of existing tourism tax for housing, this project will be able to be funded without requiring any increase in tax revenue or municipal grant funding. Due to the size of the development, there will be a ballot question for voters in November to approve or deny the project. We are hoping for a great turn-out that reflects the views of our residents. Following the vote, the project will be submitted for final approval, with a groundbreaking expected in early 2025.



BRUSH CREEK CULVERT AT LOWER KEARNS ROAD COMPLETED!

On June 3, 2023, a sinkhole that exposed primary utility lines started to develop and threatened Brush Creek Road. The Town swiftly worked to assess the extent of the damage, failure potentials, and options to repair the aged infrastructure. Town staff worked with project teams with firms SGM & Stutzman-Gerbaz to address the repair work.

On the last week of June, the final section of asphalt was installed over the new box culvert structure, completing nearly 13 months of work. Crews will continue to grade the shoulders and revegetate the disturbed areas with minimal disturbance to vehicle traffic.



The Town wants to thank the Snowmass Village Community for their patience and understanding with this project. While this project was unplanned, the resulting improvement will reliably and safely serve the community.




GASLINE & MULTIMODAL PROJECT COMPLETED HIGHLING & OWL CREEK ROADS

The Town of Snowmass Village partnered with Black Hills Energy to replace the existing gas line, install conduit for fiber optic cables, and for pavement improvements with additional multimodal components.

This project included connecting the gas line from the entrance to the Town along Brush Creek Road to the Town boundary along Owl Creek Road. This partnership also allowed for pavement widening, new asphalt overlay, and delineators for a protected pedestrian/bicycle lane. By joining together with BHE, a single paving contractor could be utilized, Frontier Paving, to ensure the efficient completion of this project.

SNOWMASS VILLAGE CELEBRATES NEW RODEO ARENA

After nearly 30 years of planning, designing, and building, the Town Park project in Snowmass Village has reached a significant milestone with the completion of Phase One. This accomplishment marks the culmination of extensive efforts by the Town Council, the Parks, Recreation & Trails Department, community stakeholders, and dedicated construction and design firms.

The journey began in 1993 when the first master plan for Town Park was completed. Over the years, various design plans have been drawn, and numerous amenities were constructed, yet the entire park remained incomplete. Recognizing the need to finalize the park, the Town's POSTR (Parks, Open Space, Trails, and Recreation) Plan in 2016 highlighted the park's completion as a priority. The Town's Comprehensive Plans and Council Goals further emphasized this necessity, leading to the development of a Town Park Master Plan.



In March 2021, the Town Council approved the Town Park Master Plan through Resolution No. 8, setting policy objectives and community goals to guide the park's completion. The POSTR Advisory Board and the Town conducted numerous meetings with community groups, stakeholders, and the Town Council to create the best possible design for Phase One. Following a consensus, the Planning Commission reviewed and approved the plan in July 2022 and the Town Council in August 2022 through Ordinance No. 5 Series of 2022.

The Town of Snowmass Village partnered with MW Golden Constructors and Connect One Design. On September 11th, 2023, construction commenced after the final rodeo of the season, ensuring no interruption to the beloved tradition. The goal was to complete Town Park, and the first rodeo of 2024 got out of the chutes as scheduled. Yee haw, mission accomplished!

With a budget of \$6.5 million, Phase One includes a multi-purpose activity field north of the rodeo arena, a new parking lot to the south, new trees and landscaping throughout the site, a significant face-lift and reorientation of the rodeo grounds, and the installation of new bleachers with seating for 2000 spectators. Last but not least, the Parks & Trails maintenance facility was built underneath the bleacher structure, best optimizing the site's limited space.

The maintenance facility, initially planned for Phase Two, was completed with Phase One. This central hub for the Parks & Trails Maintenance team includes garage bays, office space, a restroom, a workshop, and storage for equipment and supplies. This facility is essential for the department's continued success, utilizing the limited space effectively.




JULY IS NATIONAL PARKS AND RECREATION MONTH

VILLAGE SHUTTLE SUMMER SCHEDULE


The Village Shuttle summer season service schedules began in June. The Village Shuttle has also launched the *Village Shuttle* app, now available for download.


