BE BEAR AWARE IN SNOWMASS VILLAGE


Snowmass Village is in prime black bear habitat. Residents are encouraged to be bear aware and minimize the risk of bear-human interactions.

Human-bear conflicts will increase when residents leave food sources outside of their homes. Trash, recycling, and compost bins are common sources of food for foraging bears. Pet food, bird feeders, and outdoor cooking equipment such as grills and barbecues also attract bears to the home. Black bears are curious, intelligent, and very resourceful; they will explore all possible food sources. If they find food near homes, campgrounds, vehicles, or communities, they'll come back for more. The Town of

Snowmass Village urges all residents to remove food sources from their yards, vehicles, and other human-occupied areas to reduce the likelihood of bear interaction.

Bear Resistant Trash Containers

The Town of Snowmass Village maintains bear-resistant trash enclosures for residential solid waste and recycling. For those residents with curbside pick-up service, the Town has modified some trash to make them more resistant to bears. Crews installed a locking strap mechanism to bins to help reduce the likelihood that a bear is able to access the solid waste inside.

Even with these modifications, bins may only be placed outside on the day of pickup and returned to an inside location by 6:00 p.m. that same evening.

PET LICENSING IN SNOWMASS VILLAGE

Pitkin County has partnered with DocuPet to provide an enhanced pet licensing experience for residents in Snowmass Village.

Each DocuPet tag doubles as a pet's official license and comes equipped with the HomeSafe™ 24/7 lost pet service, which relies on a dedicated full-time dispatch staff and linked pet profiles to help get lost pets home quickly. Licenses may be purchased online by visiting

Dog License Fee and Rabies Certificate


Your application must be accompanied by a certificate of vaccination for rabies obtained by your veterinarian and the appropriate application fee.

Licensing application fees:

- Neutered dogs: \$10 / year
- Intact dogs: \$50 / year

Why Pet Licenses Are Important

- Of the 6.5 million pets that enter shelters, only 11% are returned to their owners
- Proper identification is critical to getting pets home safe, and reducing shelter intakes
- Shelters rely on outside funding to support the important work they do

TOWN CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATES

Proposed Roundabout at Brush Creek Road & Owl Creek Road:

The Town of Snowmass, with the design consultant team from SGM, continued with the civil engineering design for a proposed single-lane roundabout at the intersection of Owl Creek Road & Brush Creek Road.

The proposed roundabout replaces the existing intersection and also includes pavement reconstruction, additional bus stops, sidewalks, retaining walls, storm drainage, utility relocations, water line installation, and trail improvements. The Town is working with utility providers to have the necessary aging utility infrastructure upgraded simultaneously as part of this project.

This project improves the safety of the intersection and replaces aging infrastructure.

The roundabout project is currently at a 60% level-of-design. The design team is currently finalizing details with Town Staff.

The 2024 budget included \$250,000 for the design of the roundabout plans with the goal of developing the plans to provide budgetary numbers for future construction. The design team has provided a revised cost estimate based on the 60% design package of \$7.3 million dollars.

TOWN CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATES

Draw Site Workforce Housing Project:

The Town is continuing to develop plans for its first new workforce housing in 25 years. Known as the Draw Site, the proposed rental housing complex will be on the site located just behind the Town Hall. The land was deeded to the Town nearly 40 years ago with the express intent to be used as housing for people working in Snowmass Village.

The development will include 79 one-, two- and three-bedroom apartments for people working full-time for businesses serving Snowmass Village. Because the site is steep and narrow, the architects and engineers have been working on a design that rises into the hillside. It will include an underground parking structure with two residential structures above. There will be a large courtyard that will offer flexible green space and recreational options for all tenants. The floor plans will take advantage of the mountain views, and each will have a private balcony, high ceilings, and full kitchens and bathrooms.

Due to the anticipated cost, a ballot question approving the project will be posed to the voters at the November election. Thanks to Snowmass Village voters, who approved the tourism tax as an acceptable use for housing, this project will be able to be funded without requiring any increase in tax revenue or municipal grant funding.


Connecting the Nodes Project:

In early 2023, the Town Council adopted and updated their goals statement. The Strategic Initiatives of Snowmass Village include continuing to improve the multimodal connections between Base Village, the Mall and the Center. One of the Council's goals is to Ensure Public Spaces and Facilities Meet our Community's Unique Character. This goal also states: The Town Council will strive to create and improve public spaces and facilities that promote health, safety, education, happiness, and enhance community character and connectivity. The Connecting Village Nodes project aligns with these goals and initiatives.

The overall project goal is to create more functional and intuitive multimodal connections between the Snowmass Center, Base Village and the Snowmass Mall to increase economic vitality and better the visitor and local experience.

The current phase of this project is focused on developing alternatives for the connection between the Snowmass Center and Base Village including the possible use of the easement between Snowmass One and the Capital Peak Lodge. the project team has completed two reports/memos: an Existing Conditions Report and an Alternatives Memo.

Figure 11: RFTA & TOSV Shuttle Routes and Stops





BE NICE, SHARE THE TRAIL

Trail Etiquette Tips

Here are a few suggestions to ensure that you and everyone you may encounter on the trail enjoy the same amazing experiences while out on the trails.

- **Uphill Traffic Has the Right of Way** - Trail users traveling uphill on trails always have the right of way.
- **Be Trail Aware** - If you like to wear headphones while hiking or biking, ensure the volume is low enough to hear your surroundings.
- **Trail Traffic Laws** - Bikers yield to hikers, and hikers/bikers yield to equestrian riders. Horses are easily spooked. Always approach cautiously and ask the horseback rider for the best options for safely passing.
- **Dogs & Leashes** - There are no dogs allowed on Hawk Ridge Trail. All dogs should be kept on leashes when using Snowmass Village Trails. More information at tosv.com/572/Leash-Law

DON'T SPARK A WILDFIRE

Wildfire danger in Snowmass Village is elevated during the summer season.

Roaring Fork Fire Rescue reminds everyone that conditions in Snowmass Village are extremely dry. Be extra cautious with any outdoor BBQ plans, and only use designated fire pits when camping.

Never leave an open flame unattended and extinguish all fires completely.



Be Prepared- Your wildfire emergency plan must be prepared well in advance of a fire and shared with all members of your household. EV SAFE CHARGING AT HOME

SAFETY TIPS

- Use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Read and follow all manufacturer directions.
- Check chargers and cords for damage before using. Never use if damaged.
- Do not use extension cords with the charger.
- Install charging equipment in safe locations. Keep away from busy areas and things that could catch fire.
- Keep charging items out of reach of children and animals when not in use.
- Cover charging station outlet to keep water out.
- Before charging an electric vehicle at home, have a qualified electrician:
 - ~ Check your electrical system to see if it can handle charging.
 - ~ Install a new circuit just for your charging device.

Warning!

- ⚡ Electric vehicles have high voltage batteries.
- ⚡ Battery maintenance should be performed by the manufacturer.
- ⚡ Do not touch the orange high voltage cables.



For Level 1 Charging:

- Use the charging cord that came with the electric vehicle.
- Use a standard household plug.
- Make sure charger or outlet has GFCI protection.
- Use only a dedicated circuit to charge.

For Level 2 Charging:

- Use a 240-volt outlet. A qualified electrician needs to install this type of outlet.
- Only use outdoor rated charging stations outdoors.
- Keep cords off the ground.




