

SHORT-TERM RENTAL (STR) PERMITS

What are Short-term Rentals?

A short-term rental (STR) is a type of lodging wherein a dwelling unit, either in full or in part, is rented to a temporary occupant(s) for fewer than thirty (30) consecutive days. Often facilitated by peer-to-peer websites such as VRBO.com and AirBnB.com, short-term rentals are most commonly residential properties available for rent. A bed and breakfast is sometimes considered a type of short-term rental.

The Town of Snowmass Village requires hosts to obtain a business license and permit in order to offer a short-term rental as part of their property.

STR Permits

As the winter season approaches, please ensure that your Short-Term Rental Permit and Business License are up to date with the Town of Snowmass Village. We encourage all property managers and owners to familiarize themselves with our rules and regulations to avoid any violations. POLICE ALARM PERMITS

The Town of Snowmass Village Alarms Permit Program facilitates the reduction of false alarms by engaging the alarm industry, educating users, and incentivizing responsible alarm practices. Registering monitored alarms with the Town of Snowmass Village Police Department is essential to guarantee that emergency response personnel have access to the most current and accurate information for your property!

How much does a monitored alarm system permit cost?

- The cost of a Monitored alarm system permit is \$50.00 annually due at the beginning of the New Year. Renewals are sent out at the beginning of November through MUNIREvs.
- All alarms that are not renewed by January 31st of the new year will incur a \$20.00 late fee.

What are the fees for a false alarm system?

- The alarm user permit holder is subject to the following service fees for all false alarms occurring within a calendar year: January 1st to December 31st.
- Residential and Commercial Facilities:
 - 1 through 3 false alarms - no fee
 - 4 through 7 false alarms - \$100 per alarm
- Public Accommodation Complexes:
 - Zero through 5 false alarms - no fee
 - 6 through 9 false alarms - \$100 per alarm

What happens if I don't register my monitored alarm system, and a response is sent to my property?

- If a Law or Fire was sent to your home due to a monitored alarm means which signaled from an alarm system indicating that an emergency exists requires an immediate response by police, fire or emergency medical personnel. It is a Town of Snowmass Village Ordinance that an alarm user permit shall be obtained for each separate alarm system, prior to the use of the alarm system from the Police Department. Failure to do so will result in a non-compliance penalty of \$250.00. (Sec. 18-146. Noncompliance deemed unlawful and a public nuisance)

All Alarm Permits for 2024 that did not register or complete their registration after May 31st 2024 will have a late fee attached to their 2024 Alarm Registration.

The 2025 Alarm Permit fee has also been attached to your account. All 2025 alarms not registered by January 31, 2025 are considered late and will have a late fee attached to your account. If you have any questions please contact mbraisted@tosv.com and I will help you to the best of my ability.

DESTINATION MANAGEMENT PLAN COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

SNOWMASS COLORADO

Snowmass Tourism is undertaking a six-month planning process to create a five-year strategic plan that will act as the organizational “north star,” helping to define the mission and vision for the future of tourism in Snowmass, Colorado, the destination.

What is a Destination Management Plan?

A destination management plan (DMP) is a modern travel & tourism industry approach to tourism planning that guides tourism organizations towards a holistic approach to assessing and strategizing to create a roadmap to support the long-term health of destinations and the well-being of host communities. Destination management planning involves a highly participatory development process that includes all key stakeholder groups and decision-makers. Done correctly, it must be considerate of tourism governance structure, funding mechanisms, and implementation capacity.

Timeline & Stakeholder Engagement

The DMP process will include an external and internal destination assessment to understand current conditions and to invite input from stakeholders to learn about their experiences with tourism. This process will create equity amongst the community in helping to shape the vision for the future. The wider community, including tourism stakeholders, industry partners and residents, will be invited to participate in the process and asked to share their voices through surveys, interviews, focus groups, and a tourism visioning workshop. The process is designed to be inclusive and everyone is welcome.

The DMP planning process began in September 2024 and is expected to take six months. The final destination management plan will be published in April 2025 and formally adopted and implemented in the summer of 2025.

IS YOUR CAR READY FOR WINTER DRIVING?



From September 1st through May 31st, all vehicles operating on any roadway must be equipped with adequate snow tires or tire chains. Don't only rely on the 4-wheel drive; having adequate tires is essential.

Remember, you could be issued a citation if you get caught with improper tires. Do you know where that snowbrush/ice scraper is? After a storm, please clear the entire windshield and brush off the headlights and taillights!

Winter Safe Driving Tips

- 1 DRIVE SLOWLY** - Slippery roads reduce the amount of traction your tires have, and winter conditions make it more difficult to control a vehicle. Always adjust your speed down to account for lower traction when driving on snow or ice.
- 2 ACCELERATE AND DECELERATE SLOWLY** - Apply the gas slowly to regain traction and avoid skids. Don't try to get moving in a hurry and take time to slow down for a stop and turns. Remember that tire traction diminishes on icy roads.
- 3 INCREASE YOUR FOLLOWING DISTANCE** - Allow plenty of space between your car and other vehicles. This increased margin of safety will provide the longer distance needed if you have to stop.
- 4 DON'T STOP IF YOU CAN AVOID IT** - There's a big difference in the amount of inertia it takes to start moving from a full stop versus how much it takes to get moving while still rolling.
- 5 DON'T POWER UP HILLS** - Applying extra gas on snow-covered roads will just make your wheels spin. Try to get a little inertia going before you reach the hill and let that inertia carry you to the top. As you reach the crest of the hill, reduce your speed and proceed downhill slowly.
- 6 DON'T STOP GOING UP A HILL** - There's nothing worse than trying to get moving up a hill on an icy road. Get some inertia going on a flat roadway before you take on the hill.
- 7 STAY HOME WHEN POSSIBLE** - Only go out if necessary. Even if you can drive well in bad weather, it's better to avoid taking unnecessary risks by venturing out.

SNOW REMOVAL IN TOWN

The Town of Snowmass Village Road Division follows a snow removal plan each winter season. Town crews use a mix of equipment and technology to remove snow from public roadways and areas throughout the season. This creates a safe environment for motorists and pedestrians who utilize public transportation corridors. The Town prioritizes roadways according to traffic volumes, public safety requirements, bus routes, and access for emergency equipment.

The Town's fleet of snow removal equipment is prepared and ready as soon as snow is forecasted. Crews are scheduled from 5:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. seven days a week during the winter season and use three plow-and-sand trucks, two front-end loaders, and a motor grader to plow the Town's 39 miles of roadway.

The first priority for crews is major arterial roadways (Brush Creek Road, Carriage Way, Highline Road, and Owl Creek Road). The second priority is collector streets (Daly Lane, Divide Road, Horse Ranch Drive, and others). The third priority is other residential streets and parking lots.




