## PART-TIME RESIDENTS ADVISORY BOARD (PTRAB)

The Part-time Residents Advisory Board (PTRAB) provides a mechanism of improved communication between part-time residents in the Town of Snowmass Village (TOSV) and the Town Council. Part-time residents are owners, or the designated representative of an owner of real property, of various property types in the Town of Snowmass Village and who are not eligible to be registered voters in the Town. The PTRAB meets the 4th Tuesday of each month at 15:30 local time. The meetings are moderated by a Board member and graciously facilitated with assistance from the Assistant Town Manager and Town Clerk. The public is encouraged to participate by addressing the Board with concerns and comments.

The Town of Snowmass Village Part-Time Residents Advisory Board members are volunteers appointed to a 3-year term by the Town Council and carry out such duties as directed by the Town Council which provides a mechanism of communication and education between second homeowners and the Town Council. The Board provides input on issues to assist the Town Council in the establishment of town policy and advises on matters in which the Town Council believes that part-time residents can provide broad-based experience and knowledge of local issues.





# DRAW SITE WORKFORCE HOUSING PROJECT

The [Town's Comprehensive Plan](#) identified a need for 383 additional workforce housing units to meet the demand identified in 2018, before the dramatic market changes initiated by the Pandemic. The Town currently has 280 Village employees on a waiting list for our 300 rental apartments, representing a wide variety of workforce and family types. The Council has consistently named creating new affordable housing as one of its top priorities and set a goal in 2023 to create 185 new units for people working in our Village. In 2021, the Town adopted a [Workforce Housing Master Plan](#) that identified five (5) town-owned sites that could support housing development.

In late 2022, the Council directed staff to pursue development at the Town Hall Draw. The site was selected because it has the greatest potential for unit development, is well-located close to transportation and town services, was called out for affordable housing development in the Comprehensive Plan and has historically been identified for future housing development. Led by the design firm of Site Architects, a design team was engaged in the fall of 2022. Taking a "site first" approach to the site, an extended team of site specialists performed a thorough site analysis identifying site constraints and considerations to inform the design. Since then, multiple design options have been presented to the Snowmass Village Town Council for consideration and modification.



## DRAW SITE WORKFORCE HOUSING PROJECT

Due to the projected cost of developing the Draw Site, the town was required under the Town Code to secure a vote of the electorate before allocating the estimated funding needed to build this project. In November 2024, Snowmass Village voters authorized, by a vote of 61% in favor and 39% opposed, a housing development of up to approximately \$86 million and up to 79 units.

At its February 18, 2025 meeting, the Town Council directed the further development of a one-building option for the Draw Site. As currently envisioned, the building would provide approximately 65 units in an “L” shape. It will provide a mix of studios, one-bedroom, two-bedroom, and three-bedroom apartments at rents that will be affordable to the local workforce. There will be both underground parking for tenants and surface parking for visitors and delivery vehicles. The building will be accessed by a switch-back road that rises with the site, minimizing the cuts into the hillside. There will be a significant green space behind the building for use by tenants, and ample space has been reserved for tenant storage and e-bike charging.



# WILDFIRE PREPAREDNESS IN PITKIN COUNTY

Your wildfire emergency plan must be prepared well in advance of a fire and shared with all members of your household. Use the checklists provided by Pitkin County to help you prepare your family for a wildfire emergency.



One of the first steps you should take in preparing for wildfire is to Create a Family Wildfire Emergency Plan.

- Include meeting locations and communication plans and rehearse your emergency plan regularly.
- Your plan should include family pets as well as the evacuation of any large animals such as horses.
- Have fire extinguishers on hand and train your family how to use them.
- Ensure that your family knows where your gas, electric and water main shut-off controls are and how to use them.
- Plan several different evacuation routes.
- Designate an emergency meeting location outside the fire hazard area.
- Assemble an emergency supply kit as recommended by the American Red Cross.
- Appoint an out-of-area friend or relative as a point of contact so you can communicate with family members who have relocated.
- Maintain a list of emergency contact numbers posted near your phone and in your emergency supply kit.
- Keep an extra emergency supply kit in your car in case you can't get to your home because of fire.
- Have a portable radio or scanner so you can stay updated on the fire.

## WHAT'S NEW FOR WINTER 2024/2025?

Snowmass Tourism announces news for the 2024/2025 winter ski season. New restaurants, hotel renovations, and a new chairlift on Snowmass Ski Area top the season's news.

"While we are still enjoying the last days of summer, we are excited for the new additions this winter season," says Julia Theisen, Tourism Director, Snowmass Tourism. "The long-awaited Cirque Residences at Viceroy is opening, along with new restaurant concepts. Not to mention two local Basalt restaurant groups are opening locations in Snowmass: Rock Island Bar & Grill and Heather's Savory Pies. Coney Express is such a great addition to the skier experience; we cannot wait for the snow to fly!"

### Restaurant Openings & Property Renovations

- Rock Island Bar & Grill, by the owners of Basalt local favorite Hominy Southern Kitchen, debuts this winter season on the Snowmass Mall. The new concept is seafood forward, featuring coastal cuisine and mountain fare including a raw bar, fresh oysters, Po boys, shrimp & grits, New England clam chowder, and more.
- This winter the Viceroy Snowmass debuts Cirque Residences, a collection of 48 impeccably designed residences located slope-side in a brand-new luxury tower of Viceroy Snowmass. The residences' elevated modern sophistication pays homage to the surrounding beauty of the Aspen Snowmass area. Toro Restaurant by Chef Richard Sandoval reopens this winter, featuring a newly renovated space and upscale dining experience with a Latin flair, highlighted by a sensational new boutique sushi/sashimi bar.
- The Stonebridge Inn is undergoing a remodel to the lobby and restaurant starting September 2024. Slated to debut for the Winter 2024/2025 ski season, the Artisan Restaurant transforms into a new concept, Heather's Savory Pies, a longtime local establishment with a flagship restaurant in Basalt. The lobby also sees a refresh as part of phase one of the remodel. In April 2025, phase two of the remodel kicks off with room renovations, elevating each guest room to a world class standard.
- The Timberline Condominiums debuts the first phase of a major external renovation project this winter. The project significantly enhances the exterior aesthetics and functionality of each building, making them more modern and energy efficient. Featuring all new windows, sliding doors, siding, staircases, balconies, patios, and chimneys, lighting and slopeside signage, the \$20 million project will be done in two additional phases over the summers of 2025 & 2026, with an expected completion date of October 2026.

## On-Mountain Development News

- New on-mountain developments include a new chairlift, Coney Express, debuting across from the Snowmass Mall. The new chairlift replaces the Coney Glade lift and allows for easier and faster access to Snowmass' 3,300+ acres of terrain. Also new this winter season, Lynn Britt Cabin debuts a new renovation including expanded outdoor and deck space, perfect for a quick grab and go snack, or a lengthy après (featuring a new DJ booth).

## Winter Event News

- New events at the Collective Snowmass include a Jazz Supper Club series on most Friday evenings throughout the winter. Trivia returns every Thursday from 6:30-8:30 pm, while the Snowmass Live! Winter Comedy is back on Wednesdays with national and regional comics. The Collective also hosts a variety of new educational programming and community workshops, with more information to be announced.


# VILLAGE SHUTTLE WINTER SCHEDULE
