

SEASONAL WILDLIFE TRAIL CLOSURES

The Snowmass Village Animal Services Department enforces trail closures enacted to protect sensitive wildlife habitats. Per Section 10-29: Seasonal Trail Closures of the TOSV Municipal Code, it is unlawful of any persons to use by any means the following trails during wildlife-sensitive periods, as follows:

- Anaerobic Nightmare Trail: April 25 through June 27 (opens 28th)
- Sequel Trail: April 25 through June 20 (opens 21st)
- Tom Blake Trail: April 25 through June 20 (opens 21st)
- Government Trail east of Elk Camp Work Road: May 15 through June 27 (opens June 28th)
- Rim Trail North: December 1 through May 15 (opens May 16th)
- Seven Star Trail: December 1 through May 15 (opens May 16th)
- Upper North Mesa Equestrian Trail: December 1 through May 15th (opens May 16th)
- Viewline/Deadline/Ditchline: December 1 through May 15 (opens May 16th)
- Vista Trail from Powerline Trail to Government Trail is closed April 25-June 20 (opens June 21)
- Vista Trail from Government Trail to the Elk Camp Restaurant is closed May 15-June 27 (opens June 28)

Trail closures are strictly enforced by the Town's Animal Services Division, in partnership with US Forest Service, Colorado Parks & Wildlife, and Aspen Skiing Company. Wildlife monitoring cameras are in use in closed areas.

There is a zero-tolerance policy for trail closure violations and fines can reach up to \$5,000.

SEASONAL WEIGHT LIMITATIONS

Starting Saturday, March 15, through Sunday, June 15, at noon, seasonal weight limits will be in effect.

The weight restriction is 40,000 pounds, meaning dump trucks, concrete trucks, and similar vehicles must be half full.

There are no restrictions on main roads, including Carriage Way. However, all subdivisions are subject to restrictions, and signage will be posted in each subdivision.

NEW ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING BANK AT TOWN HALL

Snowmass Village is excited to announce that the new Electric Vehicle (EV) chargers at Town Hall are officially online, marking a significant milestone in the ongoing EV Charging Infrastructure Project that began in May 2022. This initiative is part of the Village's commitment to providing sustainable transportation options and supporting the growing demand for EV charging.

As part of this project, two types of chargers have been installed at the Town Hall location to serve the needs of the community and visitors:

- ChargePoint CT6000 Level 2 2-Port Charger at a rate of \$0.14 per kWh, with an additional \$5/hr fee after 6 hours of use
- ChargePoint 80 kW CPE280 DC Fast Charger (DCFC) at a rate of \$0.14 per kWh, with an additional \$5/hr fee after 60 minutes of use

We are thrilled to officially bring these EV chargers online today," said Mike Glock, Parking Manager. "This project represents a crucial step forward in our effort to provide reliable, convenient charging options while reducing our carbon footprint. We are proud to partner with Charge Ahead Colorado and Holy Cross Energy to bring this vision to life."

PITKIN COUNTY REGIONAL COMPREHENSIVE GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS REPORT

Pitkin County, the City of Aspen, the Town of Snowmass Village, and the Town of Basalt partnered to collect data and produce the emissions report, demonstrating a continued commitment to address each community's climate action goals. The report highlights that despite robust community support for ambitious climate policies, there is still a gap between current practices and our long-term goals, indicating a need for more regional partnership.

The report compares 2023 emissions across the region to 2019 pre-pandemic levels. Total emissions increased by 22% from 2019, which is largely attributed to higher quality vehicle emissions estimates and the new data source of methane emissions from the abandoned Coal Basin mine near Redstone. Additionally, the increase in emissions reflects the substantial economic growth occurring valley wide since 2019.

"This new report provides agencies with an improved and a more full picture of carbon emissions generated by our communities post-pandemic, giving us actionable information about where to focus our ongoing emissions reduction efforts," said Tim Karfs, City of Aspen Sustainability Programs Administrator.

Key findings include:

- **Total regional emissions increase:** Total regional emissions in 2023 were 753,732 metric tons of CO₂e (Carbon Dioxide Equivalent) which represents a 22% increase from 2019.
- **Cleaner electricity leads to a decrease in building sector emissions:** The report outlines how regional utility efforts to shift electricity sources to renewable energy has led to a 2% decrease in emissions from all buildings, despite increased energy consumption.
- **Transportation sector emissions increase:** The report leverages new big data sources to more accurately depict on-road transportation activity. As a result, vehicle emissions are shown to increase substantially from 2019.
- **Coal Basin mine methane is 9% of total regional emissions:** Recent work quantified the amount of methane passively leaking from the abandoned coal mine complex. Community partners such as the Community Office for Resource Efficiency (CORE) are developing solutions to mitigate these emissions.
- **Solid waste emissions increase:** Despite the success of community waste diversion programs, total landfilled waste increased from 2019, which shows the need for ongoing attention to reduce waste.

While the findings show progress in reducing emissions from the largest source (buildings), they also underscore the need for more aggressive action and regional approaches to meet emissions reduction goals. Recent policies, such as house size limits, energy budgets and building code updates are expected to significantly reduce emissions but are not reflected in the 2023 data.

“Our communities are working aggressively to curb emissions from buildings and we expect to see significant decreases in this sector in the next report. However, that means we will see transportation, waste and other emissions make up a greater proportion of the total. Solutions will have to be regional in nature which presents opportunities for future collaboration to meet our goals,” said Michael Port, Pitkin County Climate Action Analyst.

DRAW SITE WORKFORCE HOUSING PROJECT

Due to the projected cost of developing the Draw Site, the town was required under the Town Code to secure a vote of the electorate before allocating the estimated funding needed to build this project. In November 2024, Snowmass Village voters authorized, by a vote of 61% in favor and 39% opposed, a housing development of up to approximately \$86 million and up to 79 units.

At its February 18, 2025 meeting, the Town Council directed the further development of a one-building option for the Draw Site. As currently envisioned, the building would provide approximately 65 units in an “L” shape. It will provide a mix of studios, one-bedroom, two-bedroom, and three-bedroom apartments at rents that will be affordable to the local workforce. There will be both underground parking for tenants and surface parking for visitors and delivery vehicles. The building will be accessed by a switch-back road that rises with the site, minimizing the cuts into the hillside. There will be a significant green space behind the building for use by tenants, and ample space has been reserved for tenant storage and e-bike charging.



RECEIVE EMERGENCY NOTIFICATIONS THROUGH PITKIN ALERTS

Pitkin Alert is an emergency notification system that alerts residents and business owners through text messages, email, cell or land line phones.

In the event of a wildfire incident, Pitkin Alert will send you up-to-date notifications about the fire, associated road closures and evacuation orders. You must register for the free alerts at PitkinAlert.org.



RESIDENTIAL COMPOSTING

The Town of Snowmass Village offers all residents residential composting free of charge. Containers for the home are available at Public Works and Town Hall and the public drop-off container is located at the Public Works facility at 3745 Owl Creek Road.

Small amounts of food-soiled paper and compostable packaging are acceptable, including pizza and paperboard take-out containers, Please tear pizza boxes and paperboard containers into pieces before composting.

Please, no styrofoam, waxed, or plastic-covered containers, glass, silverware, cans, bottles, or plastic bags. Garbage and recycling must be kept separate from food composting materials.


