#### GET ON THE BUS GUS (actually a van)

Congratulations to our Transportation Team who was awarded an Ozone Season State Transit Grant. What's this mean.....? This grant award of about \$150K will allow TOSV to experiment this summer by renting a number of smaller transit vans that will allow us more service flexibility and thus significantly expand our service anywhere on a paved road in the Village. This new service will be able to deliver hikers and bikers to and from trails heads, it will allow diners to get to restaurants and bars and will just about get most anyone to any other place in Town on a paved road. So rather than having just fixed Route 3 and 8 (and the 22) operating, we are expecting to provide a 400% increase in summer service level. We will see how this pilot program operates June through September, learn some lessons, and determine how this idea could impact/improve/alter our future delivery of transit service. It is going to be a fascinating pilot project Literally, put on your seat belt and let the hard work begin. This is going to be an exciting adventure.

#### TID BITS

- We plan to start on the Villas North parking lot and Clubhouse Drive side of the wildfire mitigation this coming week.
- Due to site constraints with the construction activities, including the unplanned chiller due to methane, we have agreed to allow a single lane closure/traffic control situation with flaggers during the day, a traffic signal in the evening/weekend on Wood Road until June 13, 2025.
- The Forest Service provided us a heads up that it appears that they will have a window of opportunity for a prescribed fire at Sunnyside later next week. There is a red banner across the top of the RFVWC website that will take you to specifics on the Sunnyside prescribed fire. On the day of operations, smoke will be very visible from multiple locations in the upper valley. The smoke is anticipated to dissipate overnight.
- We plan for CORE to give quarterly updates to the EAB informing them on progress made investing the Town's \$300K.
- We are planning for a May launch of electric We cycle stations here in the Village. (no word yet on how the tariffs will impact our pricing). Dates, times and details to come.
- On May 19 the Planning Commission will hear a request from Ski Co to expand and tent the decks at Elk Camp. That recommendation will then go to Council.

- The proposed lighting code will also be going to the Planning Commission in May to make a recommendation.
- The Recreation Center will be closed April 23-25 for a deep clean.
- Work on the Melton Ranch trail started this week.

#### DIG AND APPLY AND LINE WE MUST FOR A SAFER VILLAGE

A new crosswalk with installed from Lot 6 to the Mall. Placement of the Phase 1 box culvert was completed earlier this week. The contractor will be backfilling for the next week or so. Pumps will no longer be necessary during Phase 1. The Phase 2 platform for vehicle and pedestrian traffic will start to be installed next week. And the culvert below Donny White curve was lined and is ready to go for the next 50 years.
