45TH ANNUAL SNOWMASS TOWN CLEANUP - MAY 16, 2025



SEASONAL WILDLIFE TRAIL CLOSURES

The Snowmass Village Animal Services Department enforces trail closures enacted to protect sensitive wildlife habitats. Per Section 10-29: Seasonal Trail Closures of the TOSV Municipal Code, it is unlawful of any persons to use by any means the following trails during wildlife-sensitive periods, as follows:

- Anaerobic Nightmare Trail: April 25 through June 27 (opens 28th)
- Sequel Trail: April 25 through June 20 (opens 21st)
- Tom Blake Trail: April 25 through June 20 (opens 21st)
- Government Trail east of Elk Camp Work Road: May 15 through June 27 (opens June 28th)
- Rim Trail North: December 1 through May 15 (opens May 16th)
- Seven Star Trail: December 1 through May 15 (opens May 16th)
- Upper North Mesa Equestrian Trail: December 1 through May 15th (opens May 16th)
- Viewline/Deadline/Ditchline: December 1 through May 15 (opens May 16th)
- Vista Trail from Powerline Trail to Government Trail is closed April 25-June 20 (opens June 21)
- Vista Trail from Government Trail to the Elk Camp Restaurant is closed May 15-June 27 (opens June 28)

Trail closures are strictly enforced by the Town's Animal Services Division, in partnership with US Forest Service, Colorado Parks & Wildlife, and Aspen Skiing Company. Wildlife monitoring cameras are in use in closed areas.

There is a zero-tolerance policy for trail closure violations and fines can reach up to \$5,000.

TOWN COUNCIL ADOPTS 2025 GOALS STATEMENT

During a regular meeting of the Town Council on Monday, April 7, members of the Snowmass Village Town Council voted unanimously to approve the 2025 Town Council Goal Statement.

Town Council works collaboratively to develop their goals after each new council is seated following an election. The goals are used to direct policy, appropriate funds, and to provide direction for staff.

The overarching priority for this Town Council is: Passionately Protect the Community Character of the Village by Promoting Balance and Emotional Connectivity. To protect the unique character of the Village and to enhance emotional and physical connections to the community, the Town Council has identified four areas of emphasis:

1. Identify & Provide More Affordable Housing
2. Embrace High Quality Balanced Destination Management
3. Develop a Detailed Area Plan in and Around the Snowmass Mall
4. Strengthen Community Engagement to Foster Emotional Connectivity
5. A Continued Commitment to Sustainability and Resiliency
6. Help Year-round Residents Thrive, Not Just Survive
7. Investing in Community infrastructure

Wildfire is a growing threat in our region, and preparation is a shared responsibility. Embers can travel miles ahead of a wildfire, igniting homes, landscapes, and structures without warning. But with the right steps, we can reduce the risk and improve our community's resilience.


Here are some essential actions you can take during Wildfire Preparedness Month:

- [Create Defensible Space](#) - Clear flammable vegetation and debris at least 30 feet from your home. Trim trees, remove dead brush, and keep grass cut short.
- [Harden Your Home](#) - Use ember-resistant vents, clean gutters regularly, and seal gaps in siding and roofing where embers could enter.
- [Prepare an Emergency Kit](#) - Build a kit with essentials like water, food, medications, flashlights, batteries, and important documents. Don't forget supplies for pets.
- [Make a Plan](#) - Know at least two evacuation routes, identify a meeting place, and ensure everyone in your household understands the plan.
- [Stay Informed](#) - Sign up for local alerts and emergency notifications through [PitkinAlert.org](https://pitkinalert.org). Follow official sources on social media and make sure your contact info is up to date.
- [Get Involved](#) - Consider joining or forming a Firewise USA® site, attending local preparedness events, or volunteering with a local emergency support group.

YOU'RE INVITED! WE-CYCLE EXPANDS SERVICE IN SNOWMASS VILLAGE

Snowmass Village has a new ride in town! WE-cycle's 90 e-bikes are designed to be used for short, transit-oriented trips to and from the bus, errands, restaurants, events, and more. Eleven stations are conveniently located throughout Snowmass Village to connect multi-family housing, commerce, and venues by e-bike.

Every ride under 30 minutes is free, please stay on bike paths, check your speed, and ride RFTA to Aspen. Sign up and take your first ride using the mobile bike checkout at we-cycle.org. Once signed up, riders have access to the Roaring Fork Valley's WE-cycle network of 100 stations and 580+ bikes in Aspen, Snowmass Village, the Mid-Valley, and Carbondale.

A ribbon cutting will take place on May 5, from 3:00–4:00 p.m. at the Chapel Curve | Owl Creek Rd WE-cycle station next to Anderson Ranch. Riders are encouraged to explore Anderson Ranch's Outdoor Sculpture Exhibition and gift shop prior to or after the event.



DRAW SITE WORKFORCE HOUSING PROJECT

The [Town's Comprehensive Plan](#) identified a need for 383 additional workforce housing units to meet the demand identified in 2018, before the dramatic market changes initiated by the Pandemic. The Town currently has 280 Village employees on a waiting list for our 300 rental apartments, representing a wide variety of workforce and family types. The Council has consistently named creating new affordable housing as one of its top priorities and set a goal in 2023 to create 185 new units for people working in our Village. In 2021, the Town adopted a [Workforce Housing Master Plan](#) that identified five (5) town-owned sites that could support housing development.

In late 2022, the Council directed staff to pursue development at the Town Hall Draw. The site was selected because it has the greatest potential for unit development, is well-located close to transportation and town services, was called out for affordable housing development in the Comprehensive Plan and has historically been identified for future housing development. Led by the design firm of Site Architects, a design team was engaged in the fall of 2022. Taking a "site first" approach to the site, an extended team of site specialists performed a thorough site analysis identifying site constraints and considerations to inform the design. Since then, multiple design options have been presented to the Snowmass Village Town Council for consideration and modification.

Why build housing at the Draw Site?

- The Town's Comprehensive Plan identified a need for **383 additional workforce housing units** to meet the demand.
- The **2021 Workforce Housing Master Plan** identified the Draw Site as a location for future housing.
- **In late 2022, the Council directed staff** to pursue development at the Town Hall Draw.
- During the November 2024 General Election, **Snowmass Village voters approved** a ballot question authorizing funding for the Draw Site project.

What's the cost?

- Estimated Monthly Rental Costs (not including utilities):
 - **Studio:** \$1,145 - \$1,445
 - **One Bedroom:** \$1,435 - \$1,735
 - **Two Bedroom:** \$1,650 - \$1,910
 - **Three Bedroom:** \$2,110 - \$2,660
- Estimated Project Cost: **\$71,770,164** (no new taxes)



TOWN CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATES

Upper Brush Creek Trail Project - This project is tentatively scheduled for the first 3 weeks of May. The remaining scope includes site cleanup, final drainage, final wall construction, and paving of the trail. This work will require a closure of the Brush Creek trail section from Wood Rd to Creekside for those three weeks.

Multimodal Trail from Mountain View to Snowmass Mall - The contractor has completed the drainage repairs below Brush Creek Rd. The final paving, guard rail, and pavement markings will be installed in May. Lane closures during construction hours on Brush Creek Rd will be required to finalize this scope.

Melton Ranch Trail Project - The gas company has nearly completed the installation of the gas line. Gould Construction will mobilize next week to begin the retaining wall replacement and trail reconstruction portion of the project. The mobilization process will have minor traffic impacts and flaggers will be on site to assist with vehicle and pedestrian movements during equipment deliveries. The user path connection from the intersection of Upper and Lower Woodbridge Rd to the trail connection to the Snowmass Center will remain open for access.

Upper Woodbridge Road Culvert Project - The Phase 2 platform for vehicles and pedestrians has been installed and opened to traffic. The contractor is excavating down to the existing culvert. The process of excavation & excavation stabilization will take numerous weeks. All work associated with the excavation will take place behind the barriers and should not affect traffic.

Wood Bridge Decking Project - The contractor is on site and has nearly completed the siding and decking project on the wood bridge. The contractor is on schedule to complete the project by the end of the week and demobilize from the site.

TOWN CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATES

The Town of Snowmass Village works year-round to provide core municipal services such as snow removal, road and infrastructure maintenance, transit, and transportation services, parks and trails maintenance, recreation programs, public safety, and strong fiscal management.

Occasionally, the Town also works on special long-term projects and initiatives. These projects typically span multiple years, and the Town seeks community input and participation to make them a success.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGERS INSTALLED AT TOWN HALL

Snowmass Village is excited to announce that the new Electric Vehicle (EV) chargers at Town Hall are officially online, marking a significant milestone in the ongoing EV Charging Infrastructure Project that began in May 2022. This initiative is part of the Village's commitment to providing sustainable transportation options and supporting the growing demand for EV charging.

As part of this project, two types of chargers have been installed at the Town Hall location to serve the needs of the community and visitors:

- ChargePoint CT6000 Level 2 2-Port Charger at a rate of \$0.14 per kWh, with an additional \$5/hr fee after 6 hours of use
- ChargePoint 80 kW CPE280 DC Fast Charger (DCFC) at a rate of \$0.14 per kWh, with an additional \$5/hr fee after 60 minutes of use

We are thrilled to officially bring these EV chargers online today," said Mike Glock, Parking Manager. "This project represents a crucial step forward in our effort to provide reliable, convenient charging options while reducing our carbon footprint. We are proud to partner with Charge Ahead Colorado and Holy Cross Energy to bring this vision to life."

SEASONAL WEIGHT LIMITATIONS

Starting Saturday, March 15, through Sunday, June 15, at noon, seasonal weight limits will be in effect.

The weight restriction is 40,000 pounds, meaning dump trucks, concrete trucks, and similar vehicles must be half full.

There are no restrictions on main roads, including Carriage Way. However, all subdivisions are subject to restrictions, and signage will be posted in each subdivision.

COLORADO'S "SLOW DOWN, MOVE OVER" LAW

Did you know Colorado's Move Over Law applies to any vehicle pulled over on the side of the road with its hazard lights flashing, not just emergency responders? In 2023, Colorado expanded its Move Over Law to protect all motorists, including passenger vehicles, emergency responders, tow trucks, utility trucks, construction vehicles and maintenance vehicles.



The law is simple:

On highways...

- Move over one lane when you see a vehicle stopped on the roadside.
- If you can't safely move over, slow down to at least 20 mph below the posted speed limit.

On all other roads...

- In a 40 mph zone, slow down to 25 mph or less.
- In a 45 mph or higher zone, slow down by at least 20 mph.

But too often, drivers fail to follow these basic steps, resulting in tragic consequences.

More than 350 motorists are struck and killed each year while outside of their vehicle on the roadside — whether changing a tire, refueling after running out of gas, dealing with a breakdown or helping a stranded driver. This is in addition to the dozens of emergency responders and tow truck drivers who are struck and killed by passing motorists while doing their job on the side of the road each year.

RECEIVE EMERGENCY NOTIFICATIONS THROUGH PITKIN ALERTS

Pitkin Alert is an emergency notification system that alerts residents and business owners through text messages, email, cell or land line phones.

In the event of a wildfire incident, Pitkin Alert will send you up-to-date notifications about the fire, associated road closures and evacuation orders. You must register for the free alerts at PitkinAlert.org.



RESIDENTIAL COMPOSTING

The Town of Snowmass Village offers all residents residential composting free of charge. Containers for the home are available at Public Works and Town Hall and the public drop-off container is located at the Public Works facility at 3745 Owl Creek Road.

Small amounts of food-soiled paper and compostable packaging are acceptable, including pizza and paperboard take-out containers, Please tear pizza boxes and paperboard containers into pieces before composting.

Please, no styrofoam, waxed, or plastic-covered containers, glass, silverware, cans, bottles, or plastic bags. Garbage and recycling must be kept separate from food composting materials.

READ THE 2024 SNOWMASS TOURISM ANNUAL REPORT

The Tourism Department develops a report highlighting the impact of Snowmass Village’s annual investment in destination marketing.

In this report, readers learn about our investments in this space and what they do for the community. In 2024, Snowmass Tourism was funded by a 2.5% sales tax and a 2.4% lodging tax. Some *key performance indicators* (KPIs) measured by the department include tax receipts, occupancy, average daily rate, and revenue per available room night.

SNOWMASS TOURISM 2024 RECAP

In 2024 Snowmass Tourism was funded by a 2.5% sales tax and a 2.4% lodging tax. Among the Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) measured by Snowmass Tourism are tax receipts, occupancy, average daily rate, and revenue per available room night.

The average daily rate at \$544 for the year reflects a 6.1% increase over 2023. Revenue Per Available Room (RevPAR) was also up, 9.6% YOY. These significant gains in average daily rate resulted in record tax collections in both funds. Marketing sales tax collections came in at \$10,228,518 and lodging tax collections at \$ 3,733,711. Overall tax revenues increased nearly 8% YOY.

Group Business was strong in 2024, with total room nights booked at 33K vs 22K in 2023, an increase of 48%.


