THRIVE SNOWMASS

Snowmass Village faces a growing challenge: the affordability gap that makes it harder for longtime residents to remain in the community. Teachers, first responders, and small business owners are among those most affected. This is about sustaining the social fabric that defines the town.

About *Thrive Snowmass*

Town Council has introduced *Thrive Snowmass*, an initiative aimed at helping residents “thrive, not just survive.” With the town 96% built out, the focus is on creative strategies to ease cost-of-living pressures and maintain community authenticity.

Key Priorities Under Consideration:

- Retaining Local Residents and Workforce: Explore measures to prevent displacement, such as targeted financial support, property-tax relief pilots, and tenant assistance.
- Reducing Daily Cost Burdens: Consider expanding child care options, promoting fare-free transit, and evaluating e-bike subsidies.
- Acknowledging Disruptive Challenges: Balance development with cultural preservation and climate resilience. Tools like the online construction map and wildfire preparedness plans help residents navigate impacts.
- Supporting Local Businesses: Strengthen mom-and-pop enterprises through procurement preferences, flexible permitting, and marketing support.
- Preserving Natural Landscapes: Protect open space and wilderness access, which remain central to the community’s identity and appeal.

These priorities build on the recently adopted Destination Management Plan, which emphasizes a community-first approach to policy and planning. Snowmass Tourism has begun implementing this shift through updated messaging, resources such as the “How-to Snowmass” guide, and initiatives that celebrate local heritage.

Next Steps

Town Council is considering forming a steering committee, conducting needs assessments, and implementing retention strategies. Thrive Snowmass represents a commitment to preserving the character and resilience of Snowmass Village for generations to come.

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING

The Town of Snowmass Village will offer free Christmas tree recycling from Thursday, December 29, 2025, through Sunday, January 11, 2026, at Town Park.

The Town of Snowmass Village will yet again be offering a location for residents to dispose of Christmas trees free of charge. The drop-off site will be available starting December 29, 2025, and will be available through January 11, 2026. An approximate location is shown on the map below. Be mindful of skier parking, as the configuration of the space may change.

This service is free of charge. Trees improperly disposed of can cause residential dumpsters to overflow and negatively impact our natural environment. Please do not dispose of trees in natural areas.

What you need to know about Snowmass Village's **Outdoor Lighting Code**

Why change the code?

- The Lighting Code revisions enhance the Town's character and livability, prevent non-compliant outdoor lighting, reduce lighting conflicts between property owners, prevent the increase of sky glow, and preserve the naturally dark sky for the benefit of residents, visitors, wildlife, and the environment.

What do I need to know?

- Passed by Town of Snowmass Village Council on September 2, 2025.
- All outdoor lighting must comply with the outdoor lighting regulations in Chapter 16A of the Town's Municipal Code.
- The Town has moved to measuring light by lumens rather than watts.
- All clear-lensed point light sources must be shielded. Any unshielded light source must use a non-clear, clouded material as the primary lens to reduce glare from the light bulb.
- The Town works on a complaint basis. The person complaining must identify themselves and submit a formal complaint in writing.
- All lighting trespass, seasonal lighting, curfew regulations, and curfew hours begin September 17, 2025.

HOLIDAY LIGHTS

The updated Outdoor Lighting chapter is based on national and international lighting best practices.

Updated policies focus on key areas, including:

- Reduce obtrusive and glaring light that inhibit human vision and detract from enjoyment;
- Curtail light pollution and improve nighttime environment for residents, visitors and astronomer enthusiasts;
- Protect local and migrating ecological systems from the adverse effect of artificial light;
- Minimize light trespass across property lines so as to avoid disturbing neighbors and restricting access to nighttime darkness as a shared natural resource;
- Bring clarity for applicants and Town review staff in evaluating lighting performance standards during the development review process;
- Differentiate residential and commercial lighting needs.

Additionally, seasonal lighting is deemed temporary between November 15 and January 31 in residential areas, and November 15 and March 1 in commercial areas, as stated in the code. Seasonal lights contribute to light pollution, attract wildlife, increase unnecessary energy usage, and when wrapped around trees, constrict their ability to grow.

Continued illumination of seasonal lighting after January 31 in residential areas, and March 31 in commercial areas, is a violation of the Land Use Code and could result in being summoned to Municipal Court.



What you need to know about Snowmass Village's **Updated STR Regulations**

Why change the code?

- Effective December 30, 2025, the revised STR regulations simplifies the permitting process, improve internal workflows, and establish a clearer renewal timeline for property managers and the lodging community.

What do I need to know?

- Permit Fee Increase: The STR permit fee will increase to \$400, effective January 1, 2026.
 - Unified Expiration Date: All STR permits will now expire on April 30 annually. To align existing permits with this date, renewals due between January and March 2026 will be assessed prorated fees:
 - \$33.33 for 1-month renewals
 - \$66.66 for 2-month renewals
 - \$100 for 3-month renewals
 - Starting in April 2026, all renewals (including prorated amounts) will be valid through April 30, 2027, and the standard renewal fee of \$400 will apply. Prorated fees will no longer be available after March 2026.
 - Trespassing Violation: Trespassing is now classified as a major violation under the updated STR regulations.

SHORT-TERM RENTAL (STR) PERMITS

The Town Council has approved an increase to the Short-Term Rental (STR) permit fee. Effective January 1, 2026, the STR Permit Fee will be \$400.

Renewals appear in the system 60 days prior to their due date, so please note that any renewals due on or after December 31, 2025 will reflect the updated fee.

A few important reminders:

- Change of Ownership: You must notify snester@snowmass.gov when there is a change of ownership, as a new permit is required. This is not optional.
- Sales/Lodging Tax: Sales/Lodging tax must be remitted by the 20th of each month.
- Account Users: Please do not press the “Remove User” button. If a user needs to be removed, contact snester@snowmass.gov for assistance.


2026 BUDGET INFORMATION

During a regular meeting on November 3, the Town Council approved the 2026 Annual Budget. This action culminates a several-month process with contributions from all departments, numerous employees, the Financial Advisory Board, and three public meetings.

The 2026 Budget has been developed with an emphasis on the Town Council's Strategic Priorities. The 2026 Budget totals \$177 million and features the following highlights:

- An investment in employees through competitive wages and benefits. New positions were added in the Town Manager's Office and Human Resources.
- An investment in infrastructure with \$129 million in capital projects, including the Draw Site Employee Housing Project, the Little Red Schoolhouse, the roundabout project at Brush Creek Road & Owl Creek Road, and the Villas North Exterior Remodel project.
- Continued investment towards the Town's environmental goals, including funding for building electrification & efficiency studies, feasibility of fleet electrification, wildfire mitigation, and waste diversion.
- Exploring and investing in the community through increased engagement and finding ways for community members to thrive, not just survive.

TOWN CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATES

The Town of Snowmass Village works year-round to provide core municipal services such as snow removal, road and infrastructure maintenance, transit, and transportation services, parks and trails maintenance, recreation programs, public safety, and strong fiscal management.

Occasionally, the Town also works on special long-term projects and initiatives. These projects typically span multiple years, and the Town seeks community input and participation to make them a success.

Roundabout at Brush Creek & Owl Creek Roads

What's happening at this intersection?

- The proposed roundabout replaces the existing intersection and also includes pavement reconstruction, additional bus stops, pedestrian walkways, retaining walls, storm drainage, utility improvements, and multimodal trail improvements.
- This project improves the safety of the intersection for all users.

Why a roundabout?

- Improving this intersection with a roundabout improves its safety and functionality for all users - motorists, bicyclists, pedestrians, and transit services.
- This construction will allow the Town and its partner agencies to update critical underground utilities & other infrastructure.
- This intersection currently operates at a *failing level-of-service*. Safety is compromised during inclement weather, busy times of the year, and other operating conditions.

What's the cost?

- Estimated Project Cost: **\$8,500,000**

Why build housing at the Draw Site?

- The Town's Comprehensive Plan identified a need for **383 additional workforce housing units** to meet the demand.
- The **2021 Workforce Housing Master Plan** identified the Draw Site as a location for future housing.
- **In late 2022, the Council directed staff** to pursue development at the Town Hall Draw.
- During the November 2024 General Election, **Snowmass Village voters approved** a ballot question authorizing funding for the Draw Site project.

What's the cost?

- Estimated Monthly Rental Costs (not including utilities):
 - **Studio:** \$1,145 - \$1,445
 - **One Bedroom:** \$1,435 - \$1,735
 - **Two Bedroom:** \$1,650 - \$1,910
 - **Three Bedroom:** \$2,110 - \$2,660
- Estimated Project Cost: **\$71,770,164** (no new taxes)

How many units?

- **Total Housing Units:** 63
- **Total Parking Spaces:** 102

What's happening at the Little Red Schoolhouse?

- Expanding childcare capacity from approximately 25 students to approximately 65 students.
- Adding four new classrooms in an updated building.
- Improving playground and outdoor learning spaces.

Why expand access to childcare in Snowmass Village?

- Adequate access to childcare is an important component of thriving communities.
- In 2021, Town Council adopted a goal to “Explore an enhanced use of the Little Red Schoolhouse to provide an improved and enlarged childcare/early learning facility.”
- The existing childcare facility has exceeded its capacity and is currently on a waitlist.

What's the cost?

- Estimated Project Cost: **\$8,500,000**

Transit Center

Why add a Transit Center to the Snowmass Mall?

- Combines **local & regional transit** in one location.
- Meets **current demand** - RFTA & Village Shuttle have dedicated spaces.
- Improve **transit users' experience** - adds restrooms and improves waiting areas.
- Improve **accessibility** and **welcome experience** to the Snowmass Mall.

How did we get to this point?

- **Over 40 years of public transit** planning and service.
- Support from **local, regional, and federal** transit partners.
- **Conceptual design & environmental assessment** completed.

What's the cost?

- The project is estimated to cost between \$40-60M, depending on design elements.
- Current funding structure:
 - Local sources: **\$9 million**.
 - Federal sources: **\$13.5 million**.
 - Approximate **\$20M funding gap** to be filled by a combination of local, state, and federal sources.

IS YOUR CAR READY FOR WINTER DRIVING?



From September 1st through May 31st, all vehicles operating on any roadway must be equipped with adequate snow tires or tire chains. Don't only rely on the 4-wheel drive; having adequate tires is essential.

Remember, you could be issued a citation if you get caught with improper tires. Do you know where that snowbrush/ice scraper is? After a storm, please clear the entire windshield and brush off the headlights and taillights!

Town of Snowmass Village Winter Safe Driving Tips

- 1

DRIVE SLOWLY - Slippery roads reduce the amount of traction your tires have, and winter conditions make it more difficult to control a vehicle. Always adjust your speed down to account for lower traction when driving on snow or ice.
- 2

ACCELERATE AND DECELERATE SLOWLY - Apply the gas slowly to regain traction and avoid skids. Don't try to get moving in a hurry and take time to slow down for a stop and turns. Remember that tire traction diminishes on icy roads.
- 3

INCREASE YOUR FOLLOWING DISTANCE - Allow plenty of space between your car and other vehicles. This increased margin of safety will provide the longer distance needed if you have to stop.
- 4

DON'T STOP IF YOU CAN AVOID IT - There's a big difference in the amount of inertia it takes to start moving from a full stop versus how much it takes to get moving while still rolling.
- 5

DON'T POWER UP HILLS - Applying extra gas on snow-covered roads will just make your wheels spin. Try to get a little inertia going before you reach the hill and let that inertia carry you to the top. As you reach the crest of the hill, reduce your speed and proceed downhill slowly.
- 6

DON'T STOP GOING UP A HILL - There's nothing worse than trying to get moving up a hill on an icy road. Get some inertia going on a flat roadway before you take on the hill.
- 7

STAY HOME WHEN POSSIBLE - Only go out if necessary. Even if you can drive well in bad weather, it's better to avoid taking unnecessary risks by venturing out.

SNOW REMOVAL IN TOWN

The Town of Snowmass Village Road Division follows a snow removal plan each winter season. Town crews use a mix of equipment and technology to remove snow from public roadways and areas throughout the season. This creates a safe environment for motorists and pedestrians who utilize public transportation corridors. The Town prioritizes roadways according to traffic volumes, public safety requirements, bus routes, and access for emergency equipment.

The Town's fleet of snow removal equipment is prepared and ready as soon as snow is forecasted. Crews are scheduled from 5:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. seven days a week during the winter season and use three plow-and-sand trucks, two front-end loaders, and a motor grader to plow the Town's 39 miles of roadway.

The first priority for crews is major arterial roadways (Brush Creek Road, Carriage Way, Highline Road, and Owl Creek Road). The second priority is collector streets (Daly Lane, Divide Road, Horse Ranch Drive, and others). The third priority is other residential streets and parking lots.

RESIDENTIAL COMPOSTING

The Town of Snowmass Village offers all residents residential composting free of charge. Containers for the home are available at Public Works and Town Hall and the public drop-off container is located at the Public Works facility at 3745 Owl Creek Road.

Small amounts of food-soiled paper and compostable packaging are acceptable, including pizza and paperboard take-out containers, Please tear pizza boxes and paperboard containers into pieces before composting.

Please, no styrofoam, waxed, or plastic-covered containers, glass, silverware, cans, bottles, or plastic bags. Garbage and recycling must be kept separate from food composting materials.


