TIME TO GET ROUNDAABOUT READY

Beginning in mid-March, motorists should expect construction impacts at Brush Creek Road and Owl Creek Road through November.

The \$8.5 million project will build a roundabout and upgrade roadways, bus stops, utilities, drainage, and pedestrian connections.

Minor delays, lane shifts, and detours are expected. Bus stops close after ski season and reopen in November.

The Town of Snowmass Village invites all residents to apply for the Thrive Advisory Committee.

Who Should Apply

Town Council seeks a broad cross-section of residents who keep Snowmass running. That includes seniors, young adults, working professionals, parents and caregivers, part-time homeowners, business owners and managers, teachers and school staff, Aspen Skiing Co. employees and resort workers, individuals in service, health care, and public safety, and residents across housing types and income levels.

Prior board experience is not required. What matters most is a commitment to collaboration, respectful dialogue, and constructive solutions that support all residents.

Service Includes

Attending public meetings, participating in outreach, reviewing materials on affordability and quality of life, collaborating with Town staff and stakeholders, and developing recommendations for Town Council. Terms will run no later than the end of 2026.

Application Process

Apply through the online form at snowmass.gov/613/Thrive-Advisory-Committee. Applicants will provide contact information, residency confirmation, a statement of interest, community connection, relevant experience, and any potential conflicts of interest. Appointments will be made by Town Council with the goal of forming a balanced, inclusive committee.

SALES TAX REBATES

Applications are now available for the Town of Snowmass Village sales tax rebate. Qualified applicants may apply for a rebate online.

The Town of Snowmass Village provides a \$200 sales tax rebate to all qualified full-time residents each . This rebate program intends to offset sales tax collected from residents. Rebate checks are mailed to residents. The application must include an appropriate local mailing address.


The 2025 Rebate Application is now open. Applications for the 2025 Resident Sales Tax Rebate must be received by March 15, 2026.

Individuals must be residents of Snowmass Village for the entire 2025 calendar year to qualify for a rebate. Qualified residents must prove residency in Snowmass Village through voter registration. If you are applying as a family, please have both partners sign and fill in all the required dependent information.

No further proof of residency is required if you are registered to vote in Snowmass Village. If you are not registered to vote, you will be required to upload a copy or photo of one of the following:

- 1.Driver’s License with a Snowmass Village Address
- 2.A lease agreement with a Snowmass Village Address

BEAR SEASON RETURNS

With the arrival of early spring, black bears will soon begin emerging from their winter dens in Snowmass Village.

Wildlife officials — including Snowmass Village Police animal control officers and Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) — urge residents to secure all food and scent attractants to help prevent human-bear conflicts.

Black bears are generally shy omnivores that prefer to avoid people.

During spring through fall, they forage for grasses, buds, berries, nuts, insects, and small animals while rebuilding fat reserves.

Conflicts most often occur when bears gain access to human food. Proper food storage and keeping a safe distance significantly reduce risk.

According to CPW, adult males typically emerge first, followed by females without cubs. Females with newborn cubs are usually the last to appear, often in April.

Early-season foods such as grasses and leaf buds help bears transition their digestive systems after months without eating.



Report Bear Sightings

To report a bear sighting in Snowmass Village, email Snowmass Village Animal Services or call 970-923-5330. Early reporting helps officials track bear movement and prevent conflicts.

If You Encounter a Bear:

- Stay calm and do not run.
- Stand tall and speak firmly.
- Slowly back away while facing the bear.

If a bear approaches, hold your ground and be prepared to use bear spray. In the rare event of an attack, fight back — playing dead is not recommended with black bears.

SHORT-TERM RENTAL (STR) PERMITS

The Town Council has approved an increase to the Short-Term Rental (STR) permit fee. Effective January 1, 2026, the STR Permit Fee is \$400.

Renewals appear in the system 60 days prior to their due date, so please note that any renewals due on or after December 31, 2025, will reflect the updated fee.

A few important reminders:

- Change of Ownership: You must notify snester@snowmass.gov when there is a change of ownership, as a new permit is required. This is not optional.
- Sales/Lodging Tax: Sales/Lodging tax must be remitted by the 20th of each month.
- Account Users: Please do not press the “Remove User” button. If a user needs to be removed, contact snester@snowmass.gov for assistance.

What you need to know about Snowmass Village's **Updated STR Regulations**

Why change the code?

- Effective December 30, 2025, the revised STR regulations simplifies the permitting process, improve internal workflows, and establish a clearer renewal timeline for property managers and the lodging community.

What do I need to know?

- Permit Fee Increase: The STR permit fee will increase to \$400, effective January 1, 2026.
 - Unified Expiration Date: All STR permits will now expire on April 30 annually. To align existing permits with this date, renewals due between January and March 2026 will be assessed prorated fees:
 - \$33.33 for 1-month renewals
 - \$66.66 for 2-month renewals
 - \$100 for 3-month renewals
 - Starting in April 2026, all renewals (including prorated amounts) will be valid through April 30, 2027, and the standard renewal fee of \$400 will apply. Prorated fees will no longer be available after March 2026.
 - Trespassing Violation: Trespassing is now classified as a major violation under the updated STR regulations.

ROUNDAABOUT AT BRUSH CREEK ROAD & OWL CREEK ROAD


This project constructs a roundabout at the intersection of Brush Creek Road & Owl Creek Road to improve safety, traffic flow, aesthetics, and mobility. It will also update utilities within the intersection. Funding covers all construction costs, including material testing and inspections.

The Town has partnered with utility providers to upgrade aging utility infrastructure simultaneously as part of this project. This project starts in March 2026 and is expected to be completed in November 2026. The total project cost is \$8.5 million.

Roundabout at Brush Creek & Owl Creek Roads

What's happening at this intersection?

- The proposed roundabout replaces the existing intersection and also includes pavement reconstruction, additional bus stops, pedestrian walkways, retaining walls, storm drainage, utility improvements, and multimodal trail improvements.
- This project improves the safety of the intersection for all users.

Why a roundabout?

- Improving this intersection with a roundabout improves its safety and functionality for all users - motorists, bicyclists, pedestrians, and transit services.
- This construction will allow the Town and its partner agencies to update critical underground utilities & other infrastructure.
- This intersection currently operates at a *failing level-of-service*. Safety is compromised during inclement weather, busy times of the year, and other operating conditions.

What's the cost?

- Estimated Project Cost: **\$8,500,000**

Why build housing at the Draw Site?

- The Town's Comprehensive Plan identified a need for **383 additional workforce housing units** to meet the demand.
- The **2021 Workforce Housing Master Plan** identified the Draw Site as a location for future housing.
- **In late 2022, the Council directed staff** to pursue development at the Town Hall Draw.
- During the November 2024 General Election, **Snowmass Village voters approved** a ballot question authorizing funding for the Draw Site project.

What's the cost?

- Estimated Monthly Rental Costs (not including utilities):
 - **Studio:** \$1,145 - \$1,445
 - **One Bedroom:** \$1,435 - \$1,735
 - **Two Bedroom:** \$1,650 - \$1,910
 - **Three Bedroom:** \$2,110 - \$2,660
- Estimated Project Cost: **\$71,770,164** (no new taxes)

How many units?

- **Total Housing Units:** 63
- **Total Parking Spaces:** 102

What's happening at the Little Red Schoolhouse?

- Expanding childcare capacity from approximately 25 students to approximately 65 students.
- Adding four new classrooms in an updated building.
- Improving playground and outdoor learning spaces.

Why expand access to childcare in Snowmass Village?

- Adequate access to childcare is an important component of thriving communities.
- In 2021, Town Council adopted a goal to “Explore an enhanced use of the Little Red Schoolhouse to provide an improved and enlarged childcare/early learning facility.”
- The existing childcare facility has exceeded its capacity and is currently on a waitlist.

What's the cost?

- Estimated Project Cost: **\$8,500,000**

Transit Center

Why add a Transit Center to the Snowmass Mall?

- Combines **local & regional transit** in one location.
- Meets **current demand** - RFTA & Village Shuttle have dedicated spaces.
- Improve **transit users' experience** - adds restrooms and improves waiting areas.
- Improve **accessibility** and **welcome experience** to the Snowmass Mall.

How did we get to this point?

- **Over 40 years of public transit** planning and service.
- Support from **local, regional, and federal** transit partners.
- **Conceptual design & environmental assessment** completed.

What's the cost?

- The project is estimated to cost between \$40-60M, depending on design elements.
- Current funding structure:
 - Local sources: **\$9 million**.
 - Federal sources: **\$13.5 million**.
 - Approximate **\$20M funding gap** to be filled by a combination of local, state, and federal sources.

IS YOUR CAR READY FOR WINTER DRIVING?



From September 1st through May 31st, all vehicles operating on any roadway must be equipped with adequate snow tires or tire chains. Don't only rely on the 4-wheel drive; having adequate tires is essential.

Remember, you could be issued a citation if you get caught with improper tires. Do you know where that snowbrush/ice scraper is? After a storm, please clear the entire windshield and brush off the headlights and taillights!

Winter Safe Driving Tips

- 1 DRIVE SLOWLY** - Slippery roads reduce the amount of traction your tires have, and winter conditions make it more difficult to control a vehicle. Always adjust your speed down to account for lower traction when driving on snow or ice.
- 2 ACCELERATE AND DECELERATE SLOWLY** - Apply the gas slowly to regain traction and avoid skids. Don't try to get moving in a hurry and take time to slow down for a stop and turns. Remember that tire traction diminishes on icy roads.
- 3 INCREASE YOUR FOLLOWING DISTANCE** - Allow plenty of space between your car and other vehicles. This increased margin of safety will provide the longer distance needed if you have to stop.
- 4 DON'T STOP IF YOU CAN AVOID IT** - There's a big difference in the amount of inertia it takes to start moving from a full stop versus how much it takes to get moving while still rolling.
- 5 DON'T POWER UP HILLS** - Applying extra gas on snow-covered roads will just make your wheels spin. Try to get a little inertia going before you reach the hill and let that inertia carry you to the top. As you reach the crest of the hill, reduce your speed and proceed downhill slowly.
- 6 DON'T STOP GOING UP A HILL** - There's nothing worse than trying to get moving up a hill on an icy road. Get some inertia going on a flat roadway before you take on the hill.
- 7 STAY HOME WHEN POSSIBLE** - Only go out if necessary. Even if you can drive well in bad weather, it's better to avoid taking unnecessary risks by venturing out.

SNOW REMOVAL IN TOWN

The Town of Snowmass Village Road Division follows a snow removal plan each winter season. Town crews use a mix of equipment and technology to remove snow from public roadways and areas throughout the season. This creates a safe environment for motorists and pedestrians who utilize public transportation corridors. The Town prioritizes roadways according to traffic volumes, public safety requirements, bus routes, and access for emergency equipment.

The Town's fleet of snow removal equipment is prepared and ready as soon as snow is forecasted. Crews are scheduled from 5:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. seven days a week during the winter season and use three plow-and-sand trucks, two front-end loaders, and a motor grader to plow the Town's 39 miles of roadway.

The first priority for crews is major arterial roadways (Brush Creek Road, Carriage Way, Highline Road, and Owl Creek Road). The second priority is collector streets (Daly Lane, Divide Road, Horse Ranch Drive, and others). The third priority is other residential streets and parking lots.

RESIDENTIAL COMPOSTING

The Town of Snowmass Village offers all residents residential composting free of charge. Containers for the home are available at Public Works and Town Hall and the public drop-off container is located at the Public Works facility at 3745 Owl Creek Road.

Small amounts of food-soiled paper and compostable packaging are acceptable, including pizza and paperboard take-out containers, Please tear pizza boxes and paperboard containers into pieces before composting.

Please, no styrofoam, waxed, or plastic-covered containers, glass, silverware, cans, bottles, or plastic bags. Garbage and recycling must be kept separate from food composting materials.




What's Our Drought Status?

See current drought map






